News From Pastor Ryan:

Hello Church,

With all of the current precautions in place for COVID-19, in a matter of weeks we have seen our way of life change dramatically. Each day the news changes and we rapidly try to adapt to the new paradigm in front of us. Many of you know I pride myself on having a vision for the future. Rhonda and I often share a laugh when she sees my white board scrawled with sermon ideas 3-6 months out. I always want to know what's going to happen next. In this situation, we can't know. I'm writing you this letter a few hours after Gov. DeWine has issued the stay-at-home order for Ohio. By the time you receive it, who knows what new information will have come to light.

It's difficult when God takes us places where we don't know what's coming. There's a fear that comes over us as we look into the future. During this pandemic, many movie companies have been quick releasing new movies for people to catch up on. That includes Disney's Frozen 2 which features the song "Into the Unknown". At the end of the song, Elsa sings this;

"Where are you going? Don't leave me alone. How do I follow you? Into the unknown?"

I think we often would ask God similar questions. When we go through struggles and darkness in our lives, we ask God if we've been left alone and struggle with how we can follow God into the uncertain future. Joshua experienced this when he was asked to take up the role of leader of the Israelites after Moses died. Joshua was going to be the one to lead the Israelites to the Promised Land, where they would encounter other people and armies as they received the land God gave them. They were entering the unknown, but it was a place where God would be with them. God tells them this:

"Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go." -Joshua 1:9

We are in the unknown, but we must remember that God is with us wherever we go! While we are presented with new parameters for how we live our lives currently, we know that God is in control. God will carry us, even into the unknown. What should we do? Be strong and courageous. Remain steadfast in our belief that God, who has carried us through hard days before, is faithful and true and will carry us through. We're preparing for Easter. And even if we don't celebrate Easter in the same way this year (or celebrate it later!) our hearts are prepared to leave the dark tomb of death and despair and enter into the light of God's new day!

This edition of the tidings is full of question marks and plan that we aren't sure will unfold the way we think. And that's okay. God is the God of all our days. More powerful than our fear. Unshakable. If we trust in Him, we will find our secure and our future, in this world or the next.

Stay safe, stay healthy, and I can't wait to worship with you all again.
