

Book Review

It's Never Too Late to Read Ron Chernow's Alexander Hamilton

By now almost everyone knows about the block-buster success of Lin-Manuel Miranda's fantastic musical, and most people know it was based almost 100% on Ron Chernow's Alexander Hamilton biography, but that doesn't mean history buffs should skip reading Chernow's book. As background, he points out that he wrote it as a change of pace from his previous books. In 1990, he won the National Book Award for Nonfiction for *The House of Morgan: An American Banking Dynasty*, then three years later *The Warburgs: The Twentieth-Century Odyssey of a Remarkable Jewish Family* was awarded the Columbia Business School's George S. Eccles Prize for Excellence in Economic Writing. *The 1998 Titan: The Life of John D. Rockefeller, Sr.* was selected both by Time and the New York Times as one of the year's ten best books "One of the great America biographies."

It really was not much of a stretch for Chernow to jump from writing about the rich and famous in the world of finance to the life of the first Secretary of the Treasury of the newly-formed United States. That guy on the ten-dollar bill set up much of the financial underpinning of our country including the Bank of the United States, import tariffs and the Coast Guard to enforce them, a series of lighthouses to support the Coast Guard, and, to the dismay of the westerners in the hills beyond the Coastal States, a highly controversial tax on whiskey. Busy guy with a brilliant vision of how a government should function. Of course, Alexander Hamilton had his faults his peccadilloes – just listen to Miranda's sound track to learn where that led. But when you read Chernow's book and put Hamilton in the context of his time, you conclude that his behavior was not as extreme as it might at first appear. In fact, when you glimpse the goings-on within the extreme political rivalries of the Federalist and Republicans of the day, you conclude that much of the egregious behavior of political opponents in our 21st Century sinks to amateur status in comparison. Back in the 18th Century in a country with an unusually high literacy rate, opponents not only resorted to loading their dueling pistols, they also published scurrilous books, pamphlets and newspaper articles focused on demolishing the reputations of their challengers. And "fighting words" really WERE fighting words, as Hamilton found out when he challenged Aaron Burr.

But fear not, if you pick up a copy of Chernow's 2010 book *Washington: A Life* you will be reassured that he was one political figure who managed to behave in a statesmanlike manner. (The book won the Pulitzer Prize for Biography. And next? Look forward to an upcoming biography of Illinois's own Ulysses S Grant. And while you are at it, you might want to pick up copies of those earlier Chernow books to judge for yourself why he keeps on winning all the top awards year after year.

My Mayflower Story

With the exception of one cousin, most of my mother's family had no idea that we had ancestors on the Mayflower. This cousin told me she thought we might be descended from William Brewster and Isaac Allerton. After searching the Virginia and Kentucky state libraries and historical societies I discovered she was right!

However, there was one troublesome great-great-great-grandmother, Mary Lee. She seemed to have vanished off the face of the earth between the 1870 census and 1880 census. As part of my application to the Mayflower Society, Historian Max Brown wanted me to find out when and where she died.

I knew that she had lived in Lafayette County, Missouri, and that she had been affiliated with the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. First, I attempted to see if there was a death record for her in the Missouri State Archives. I discovered that they didn't keep records that far back. Then I tried to find burial records for the cemetery near where she lived. There weren't any. Thirdly, I tried to find records for the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in the area. It had merged with the United Presbyterian Church, but that church had burned around 1900.

Finally I thought about trying to find an obituary in a local newspaper for the 1870's. I went to the Lafayette County Library and asked if there were 19th century newspapers on microfilm. Yes, I was told, there were four of them. I asked if any had been published continuously through the 1870's. The librarian laughed. No, none of them had been. Then, I asked if any had been indexed. She laughed again. No, none of them were indexed. I was told that the Lexington Register had the best, though incomplete, coverage of that decade.

I got the microfilm for the Lexington Register on inter-library loan. I realized that I was looking for a needle in a haystack. I also wondered when a healthy genealogical investigation turns into an insane obsession.

The obituary column was on page 2 of each issue. I found if I rotated the scrolling knob one full turn I could get from one obituary column to the next. After about an hour, when I was starting to get queasy, there she was! She had died at her home near Odessa, Lafayette County, in 1872.

Remembering Governor Ralph Moore

We are saddened to share with our membership that Ralph Lawrence "RL" Moore, former Governor of the Society of Mayflower Descendants in the State of Illinois, passed away Tuesday, June 6, 2017, at his residence in Rochester, Illinois. Ralph was born July 28, 1941, in Springfield. He is survived by his widow, Carolyn; daughter, Sarah (Jason) Moore Musgrave; granddaughter, Julia Lynn Musgrave; brother, Carl "Bud" Moore; and several nieces and nephews.

Ralph joined the Society of Mayflower Descendants in the State of Illinois in 1997 under the ancestor, John Howland. During the twenty years since, he served as an Assistant, Corresponding Secretary, Deputy Governor, Governor, and Elder. He was a founding member and Lt. Governor of the Great Prairie Colony in Central Illinois. In the General Society of Mayflower Descendants, he served on the Nominating Committee and the 2020 Committee, looking forward enthusiastically to the 400 year anniversary of the Pilgrims' landing at Plymouth. He was also a former member of the New England Genealogical Society. Ralph never missed an opportunity to share information about the Pilgrim history, doing displays at local libraries and presenting Thanksgiving programs at the public schools.


Ralph attended MacMurray College, Illinois State University, and Litchfield University in Connecticut, and completed graduate degrees at the University of Illinois in Urbana. He taught for 32 years in Springfield Public Schools and operated the Berry Patch gift stores in Rochester and Pentwater, Michigan, with his wife, Carolyn. They also owned Henry's Restaurant at the Kensington House in Rochester.

Ralph was also a member of the Rochester Historical Preservation Society, Rochester Masonic Lodge 635 AF&AM, Sangamon County Historical Society, and Westminster Presbyterian Church. He was a former member of the Regional Board of School Trustees of Menard and Sangamon Counties for many years. Ralph and his wife, Carolyn, were named Citizens of the Year in Rochester in 2008.

RL, as friends and family affectionately called him, enjoyed spending time with his loving family, especially his granddaughter, Julia, who was the light of his life. He enjoyed traveling, genealogy, history, antiquing, and spending his summers in Pentwater, Michigan.

Services have been held. Memorial contributions may be made to the Rochester Historical Preservation Society, The Ronald McDonald House or the charity of the donor's choice.

Ralph Moore contributed greatly to the Society of Mayflower Descendants in the State of Illinois and to the General Society of Mayflower Descendants. He was always cheerful and full of energy. Ralph was very much loved and will be greatly missed by all of us who were lucky enough to have known him throughout the years.
