She gave piano lessons, taught a Kindermusic program, played organ and piano at

She loved being outdoors, including hiking, camping, 4-wheeling, and riding with her husband, Eddie, in his dune-buggy.

Mountain Climbing Ministry Experience By Meriam Abella, Philippines

Six of us are going to climb the tallest mountain this morning to give a Bible study to people gathered in the banana packing area. A mother and her son, active youth members in the Pao Pao church went with us. They were our guide on a steep trail going down the river. After crossing the river, we went up, up, up on the tallest mountain. Brother Rabadon and I were using rods to help us in going up, and in going down. My knees were trembling passing over a tough trail with grasses. A rod is very helpful to hold onto where there are no tall grasses or trees to help hold onto the steep trail. I remember the nice cement trail at Lake Cebu where we had railings to hold onto! It was easy compared to this trail without steps or railings. Sometimes I even crawled! We en-

ioved our ministry.

We left home at 5:45am and arrived at Pao Pao Church at 6:45am. We had hiked from 7am to 10am to reach our destination. We rested in the banana packing area for about 15 minutes, then the people gathered around from the banana fields. They are all harvesters of bananas. You can see people gathering bunches of bananas in our picture.



We started our Bible study while they were resting from the harvest. Winnie, MPI-sponsored Bible worker, and brother Rabadon, Winnie's helper, gave priority to Pastor Jesreel, Winnie and Meriam's son sponsored by MPI through Adopt a Minister, to conduct the Bible study. They were happy to meet our young and guapo (handsome) Pastor!

The study was limited to 30-40 minutes because it was their break time from harvesting bananas. The time keeper is an Adventist convert but inactive because their home is far from any church. They would have to hike to reach Paopao or Hillside church. The timekeeper/ area leader has a small boy and his wife is pregnant. It is hard for the couple to walk three hours each way. There are three former Adventist families in this area, all workers for the banana plantation, but no church to worship in.

Now we know that they need a church, even a small church made of light materials like bamboos, poles and G.I. sheets for roofing. They also need Hymnals and Bibles in Cebuano language. Most of them have no Bible or Hymnal. They asked me for some and I promised to buy Hymnals and Bibles from the Mission Book Center.

After our Bible study we proceeded to go up about 3kms to the barrio (village) where there is a faith gospel church. We met the pastor and set a schedule for the next week's for Bible study; we hope and pray for this.

The weather was very clear, no rain, and the sun is very hot; we felt dehydrated while hiking. Winnie, Jesreel, and brother Rabadon changed their shirts three times.

On our way, big, black nimbus clouds rolled in, covering the sun. We were afraid for the rain, because we had to cross a river and the road gets slippery but *thank you*, *God*, the clouds only gave us *shade* to cover us from the very hot sun! *God is good*—all the time!

We arrived home safely at 4pm, all of us feeling muscle pain, but we were all happy for these *wonderful* experiences. I will never regret this trip because this is part of the ministry and the people were inspired to hear the Bible study; especially the inactive Adventists. We did not know that there are people in that far place who were Adventist and needed encouragement and a church to worship in.

Greetings in Jesus' name, In the afternoon, I left Belmopan and went to the

little village of Teakettle, where another grandmother and evangelist is my aid in the work there. Sister Mercedes Ruiz is a recent convert of not more than three years; yet she is not only on fire for the Lord, but also the leader of the group in Teakettle. The hope is to finish an unfinished building that the church had purchased with the intent of one day holding church service there. She presently holds four meetings at night, visitation and Bible studies during the day, and Sabbath

services, mostly by herself. Her two daughters assist her; one recently joined the church this January in an Evangelistic campaign done by the district pastor, Angelo Dominguez. He and other elders also assist her as they can, but Teakettle being so far from any Adventist presence creates an obstacle at times.

I'm privileged to be able to assist on Tuesday afternoons and on Sabbath when I can get a break from my local church, and also when transportation is available. This particular afternoon, however, our study, almost complete, was interrupted by an uninvited guest.

We were having our regular study with Ms. Rebecca. Ms. Rebecca is convicted on the Sabbath, but attends another Sabbath keeping church in Esperanza. We have been studying with her for some time now. The previous week we had studied on the Remnant church, and she accepted the Seventh-day Adventist church as God's last day church. The next study was on the Gift of Prophecy.

As we were explaining the role of Ellen White in the church, fulfilling this particular prediction and requirement of God's last day church; just after I made the appeal to accept the gift in God's church, and was about to hand her a magazine by Ellen White entitled "A Love Stronger Than Death," sister Mercedes called out rather calmly, "sister, there is a snake in your yard!"

As we turned in the direction she was looking, some distance from us, we all were startled by the size of it. This wasn't the first time we had encountered a snake during Bible studies, but this was a big one. It was a little longer than a machete; with a thick body. Fearing that it could hurt one of the children that reside there, the owner had asked me to "do away with it." Although I was kind of nervous, with a prayer and stick I did.

This young lady in Mexico received MPI assistance this year and sent a note of appreciation.


Dear Friends,
