



FOOD IS OBTAINED FROM THEIR OWN CATERER AND THE BAR PACKAGE IS PROVIDED BY THE COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS: \$5.00 PER PERSON FOR BAR, \$30.00 FLAT RATE FOR THE BARTENDERS AND CLEANING AFTERWARDS. THIS POLICY DOES NOT EXTEND TO FAMILY MEMBERS OF MEMBERS THAT PASS AWAY, I.E. WIVES, SISTERS, BROTHERS ETC. ONLY THE MEMBER HIMSELF. THIS HALL USAGE POLICY DOES NOT APPLY TO COLUMBIETTES.

HALL USAGE FOR PAST GRAND KNIGHT PASSING

THE COUNCIL ALSO PASSED AT THAT TIME THE POLICY FOR A PAST GRAND KNIGHT WHO PASSES. IN ADDITION TO THE POLICY JUST DESCRIBED, THE COUNCIL WILL PAY FOR THE FOOD AND BAR PACKAGE. THIS IS TO BE HANDLED THROUGH THE GRAND KNIGHT AND REFERRED TO THE SALES AGENT FOR BOOKING AND SET UP.

ST. MARY

Mary, also known as St. Mary the Virgin, the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint Mary, Mary Mother of God or the Virgin Mary is the greatest of all Christian saints. The Virgin Mother "was, after her Son, exalted by divine grace above all angels and men."

Mary's life and role in the history of salvation is fore-shadowed in the Old Testament, while the events of her life are recorded in the New Testament. Traditionally, she was declared the daughter of Sts. Joachim and Anne. Born in Jerusalem, Mary was presented in the Temple and took a vow of virginity. Living in Nazareth, Mary was visited by the archangel Gabriel, who announced to her that she would become the Mother of Jesus, by the Holy Spirit.

She became betrothed to St. Joseph and went to visit her cousin, Elizabeth, who was bearing St. John the Baptist. Acknowledged by Elizabeth as the Mother of God, Mary intoned the Magnificat.

When Emperor Augustus declared a census throughout the vast Roman Empire, Mary and St. Joseph went to Bethlehem, his city of lineage, as he belonged to the House of David. There Mary gave birth to Jesus and was visited by the Three Kings.

Mary and Joseph presented Jesus in the Temple, where St. Simeon rejoiced and Mary received word of sorrows to come later. Warned to flee, St. Joseph and Mary went to Egypt to escape the wrath of King Herod. They remained in Egypt until King Herod died and then returned to Nazareth.

The first recorded miracle of Jesus was performed at a wedding in Cana, and Mary was instrumental in calling Christ's attention to the need. Mary was present at the Crucifixion in Jerusalem, and there she was given into John the Apostle's care. She was also with the disciples in the days before the Pentecost, and she was present at the resurrection and Ascension.

The belief that Mary's body was assumed into heaven is one of the oldest traditions of the Catholic Church.

Pope Pius XII declared this belief Catholic dogma in 1950. The four Catholic dogmas are: Mother of God, Perpetual virginity of Mary, the Immaculate Conception and Assumption of Mary. The feast of the Assumption is celebrated on August 15. The Assumption was the bodily taking up of the Virgin Mary into Heaven at the end of her earthly life. According to Pope Pius XII, the Virgin Mary "having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory."

In 1854, Pope Pius IX proclaimed the dogma of the Immaculate Conception - that Mary, as the Mother of the Second Person of the Holy Trinity, was free of original sin at the moment of her conception. The feast of the Immaculate Conception is celebrated on December 8. The birthday of Mary is an old feast in the Church, celebrated on September 8, since the seventh century.
