

After ANOTHER up and down show day forecast, our prayers were answered with a DRY and SUNNY day for our 17th annual Toys for Tots benefit car show! What we apparently forgot to ask for was a MILD day! Our Team showed up at Handy Hardware to sub-freezing temps and a steady chilly breeze! We will take CHILLY over RAINY every time, a definite improvement over last year!

This show normally draws over 100 show cars, but a check of other car events in the metro area showed us that we had more, *MUCH* more competition this year. We ended up with less than 70 show cars, not a bad number, but not what we were hoping for. Although nowhere near our record of toy & money donations, we still did pretty well, collecting 239 toys and \$2,150 in cash donations. We presented the cash to our Marines so they could go buy more toys to fill in the gaps.

This year, due to Rick's medical issues, we didn't do an event T-shirt or charity auction. We did step up our door prizes with some very nice items donated by Streetside Classics, Summit Racing Equipment, Year One Muscle Car Parts, Handy Hardware and Old Hickory House. Our thanks to these great businesses for their contributions.


