

'Just in Case' Card for Motorcyclists

Keep Your Information Handy – Just in Case

Motorcycle accidents happen suddenly and without warning. Most riders don't consider what happens after the accident. Who will contact your family if you're hurt? What if you're allergic to certain basic medications? If you're seriously injured in a motorcycle accident, you may not be able to communicate the answers to your doctors.

We hope you never experience an accident while you're out riding, but it's always a good decision to be prepared – just in case. That's why you should be carrying a 'Just in Case' card. Keep it with you when you're out riding. If something happens to you, your 'Just in Case' card could save your life.

What to Include on Your 'Just in Case' Card

- Name
- Address
- Emergency contact – e.g., spouse, sibling, close friend
- Emergency Contact's phone number
- Any medications you're taking
- Preexisting medical conditions
- Any Allergies
- Any other pertinent information

Why Carry a 'Just in Case' Card?

Providing your information could potentially save your life if you've been involved in a motorcycle accident. First responders will be able to quickly scan your card to learn of existing medical conditions, medications you're currently taking, and possible allergies. These details could help them make the right decisions in an emergency.

Because you may be unresponsive after an accident and time is precious, it's important that your information is readily available for the medical professionals treating your injuries. For example, if they're unaware of something as simple as a blood thinner you're prescribed for high cholesterol, your treatment may not be helpful or even make your condition worse.
