Believe it or not, November also marks the beginning of the registration process for the 2016-2017 school year. Registration for **children currently enrolled at BHPCNS** will be December 7 and 8. Applications will be available on the BHPCNS website at <u>www.bhpcns.org</u>, after Thanksgiving. Download and complete the application. Applications should be returned to BHPCNS no earlier than December 7 and no later than December 8 in order to be given priority in enrollment. Please recognize that children currently enrolled in our 2's and 3's programs as well as those children who are enrolled in the 4's program but are not age eligible for Kindergarten are guaranteed a place, but it may not be your first choice. Acceptance is based on a first come, first serve basis.

Applications may be mailed or dropped off early, but they will not be processed until after those received on December 7 and 8. (See More

- 3 day 2s, Monday-Wednesday-Friday
- 2 day 2s, Tuesday-Thursday

Young 2s: Beginning in January, if space allows and there are enough students we will offer either a 1 day or possibly 2 day young 2s class. This class would be for children who turn 2 between September 1 and December 31.

Registration for Current BHPCNS Students:

Registration for the 2017-2018 school year will soon be underway.

- Applications will be available for current students at the BHPCNS website, <u>www.bhpcns.org</u> under the Application/Registration tab after the Thanksgiving break.
- Download an application, or collect one in the office, complete the information, and return the form on either December 7 or December 8. Returning students must have their applications turned in no later than Thursday, December 8 to guarantee placement.
- Remember to indicate a first and second choice. While we guarantee placement for students currently enrolled in our 2 and 3-year-old programs and for students enrolled in the 4s who do not meet the age eligibility for public school kindergarten, we do not guarantee your first choice.
- Acceptance is based on a first-come, first-served basis. The earlier you submit your application, the greater your chances of being accepted into your first choice program.
- Applications received before December 7 will be placed after those received on December 8.

Registration for Siblings Not Currently Enrolled in BHPCNS:

October and November are the months to submit applications for currently enrolled siblings for the 2017-2018 school year. Applications are available in the office and online for your children who will be starting BHPCNS in September 2017. Registration for currently enrolled students will begin in December. Acceptance or Wait List notifications will be sent home in January.

New Applicants to BHPCNS:

Encourage your friends and neighbors to call the office to learn more and schedule a tour of BHCPNS. Bowden Skoff Reports: In November our scientific cubs, will be planting acorns that we collected last month. We have watched the acorns grow roots and will put them in soil and continue to monitor them and take care of them so we can plant them in the ground come spring. We will then start our unit on Aerodynamics. We will make Gyrocopters, paper airplanes and even make a rocket balloon by taping an inflated balloon to a straw, threading a string through the straw and watching what happens when we release the air. Before Thanksgiving break, we'll make our own butter, discuss the process that allows this to happen and even eat it for our snack. We'll end the month making birdseed feeders and talk about the importance of feeding birds during the winter when their food sources are scarce.

Colleen Snyders Reports: Our Bradley Bears Dance Troupe has been busy learning their ballet positions, body part identification and articulation, as well as the steps that will make up their recital routine. They have experimented with props and rhythms while learning fundamental movements such as chase', plie, and saute'. In November, the dancers will work on their recital combinations as they prepare their Nutcracker themed pieces. 
MONTHLY SPECIAL CLASSES AND GUEST PERFORMERS:



2s, 3s, & 4s

Music is off to a great start this year! In October, we had a great time making Alligator Stew, dancing, and playing with bells. As we move into November we will continue our musical journey into the kitchen. Using Beethoven's Ecossaise, we will follow the patterns of the music as it guides our motions and we prepare a yummy soup. We also will explore ways to play loudly and quietly on my drums, draw a poem in which we grow a plant, and sing about various foods that Mr. Chip isn't sure he wants to eat. As always, we will focus on many ways to develop our inhibitory control, creative expression, and motor development. I can't wait until the next time I am able to stop by for merry music making!

Mrs. Sutherland Shares:In November, our budding scientists will focus their investigation inward as we explore our amazing bodies and learn about some essential things we need to do to take care of them. We will learn that our heart beats like a pump, our bones give us shape and our lungs fill up with air like balloons. We will discover how food provides fuel for our bodies and gives us energy.
