Campers remain priority




NCEP granted \$3,000 for financial assistance for town children attending

Nancy Miller, the benches - made of recycled plastic - will create a more useable and comfortable space for teaching groups in the outdoor classroom.

Wellness Day huge success

The Second Annual Wellness Day was held on April 18 at the Jr./Sr. High School. All staff and students in grades 6-12 attended four miniworkshops on wellness-related topics of their choice. There were 34 presenters who volunteered their time and expertise on topics and



activities such as art therapy, hiking, ballet, cooking, Aikido, etc.

NCEP granted \$100 to Wellness

Coordinator, Lisa Kumph, for cooking supplies and other materials to support the activities.

Planting the seeds

NCEP is continuing its support of the **Garden Club at the Elementary School** with a **grant of \$178.** Nancy Miller and Nancy Wood requested

the funds which will be used to purchase wood for



the construction of an additional large raised garden bed. The larger bed will provide enough space to grow butternut squash, which they plan to share with the cafeteria.

Sensory tools help students

The Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) program at the Elementary School received a \$750 grant from NCEP to help aid children with autism in everyday activities. The



funds will be used for supplies associated with sensory

integration. These integration tools are helpful as they help focus the students and keep them calm and centered so they can excel in their daily learning.

Targeting Newmarket



NCEP, the Jr./Sr. High School Wellness Team and the Newmarket Recreation Department have

teamed up to bring **The New England School of Archery** to
Newmarket. Students in grades 612 will be given the opportunity to
take an introduction to archery
class with a Level 4 archery

instructor. **NCEP's grant of \$750** will help fund this popular program.

In order to help **promote** independent reading by Spanish



students, Claudette Moran, Spanish teacher at

the Jr./Sr. High School has been granted \$750 for the purchase of Spanish books that range from a beginning level to an intermediate level. As the students read more and become more fluent, they will become better Spanish speakers and writers.

Technology big impact for 8th grade

Science Teacher Elizabeth
Franceschini was **granted \$250** for
the purchase of a Samsung



Chromebook, and Math Teacher
Amanda Perkins was granted \$747
for the purchase of three
Chromebooks. The Chromebooks
join several others (funded by NCEP
through three previous grant cycles)
and will be shared among the whole
8th grade team. They are being
used to enhance existing programs
in the curriculum, such as Khan
Academy, BrainPOP, Collaborize
Classroom, Geogebra, Aleks, Google



Docs, etc. Use of these programs is helping students reach the new

Common Core Standards as well as ensuring the opportunity is open to all students (not just those that can afford their own device) to master skills necessary to compete in the 21st century marketplace.

Aiding afterschool learning

Cassandra Rodier, 4th grade elementary school teacher, requested a \$375 grant to provide healthy snacks for the 4th Grade

Homework Club. This is the second grant NCEP has awarded



the Club. Meeting after school, many kids arrive tired and hungry and don't have extra snacks available, or they simply forget to bring something in. Rodier's grant will be used to purchase snacks for Club participants. Providing nutritious snacks will keep the kids engaged and focused on their homework.

Exploring science

NCEP has granted \$750 to the Jr. High Science Club. Requested by Science Teacher Janice Murray, Science Club students will benefit by exploring the ever-changing world of Science through hands-on



projects, including laboratory work, chemistry in the home, ecology in the community and the physics of sports. These activities will be structured in a way that will inspire students to reach their full potential in science.

NCEP is excited to partner with the Newmarket Elementary PTA to provide \$600 toward the purchase of a Redcat amplification system to be used in the media center during all library classes. The Redcat system will enhance the learning



environment for all students at the elementary school by allowing the teacher to communicate more effectively.

More minis

NCEP continues to support the **fifth grade** at the **Elementary School** by **funding \$400** towards the purchase of iPad minis. This is the third grant requested by 5th Grade Teacher, Sheana Thorell and funded by NCEP. The iPads are making a **huge impact** and the uses in the classroom are endless.



They supplement instruction by helping teach skills to struggling learners, reinforcing skills for those who need more practice, as well as enriching students who need extended learning opportunities.

Fun & education @ home

About 25 eighth grade students will stay in Newmarket when their classmates attend the annual long weekend trip to Washington, DC. Considering opportunities for the students who do not go to DC,

8th Grade Teacher Elizabeth Franceschini **requested a \$750 grant from NCEP** to help fund three days



of curriculum that meet the same goals as the DC trip. Students will go to Star Island, explore the

history of the Newmarket Mills and visit multiple sites on the Lamprey River.

Cyber safety education

Resource Officer Wayne Stevens and Wellness Coordinator Lisa Kumph requested \$750 to educate students, staff and parents about

the dangers of using the internet as well as how to keep your



personal information safe.
Plymouth State University Police
Department **Special Investigator Jennifer Frank** will speak at an



assembly for students and staff at Jr./Sr. High School about the potential dangers of

social networking websites, such as Facebook or Instagram and about basic cyber safety and cyberbullying. She will also provide an evening presentation to parents and members of our community. The school and Newmarket police have seen a significant increase in the amount of illicit and illegal content over the past two years and will use this opportunity to address the issue with students, staff, parents and community members.

Paving the way

A grant for \$200 will help pave the way to the Elementary School's outdoor classroom and gardens



for students with mobility needs. Currently the grass and woodchip terrain makes safe

travel difficult and limiting for some students. The funding from NCEP will be added to other grants, fundraisers and donations all to be used to install the accessible pathway which will eventually extend almost 90 feet.
