Wisdom From Afar....

Yom Ha'atzmaut, Israel's Independence Day, commemorates the establishment of the modern State of Israel in 1948. Because Israel declared independence on 14 May 1948, which corresponded with the Hebrew date 5 *Iyar* in that year, *Yom Ha'atzmaut* was originally celebrated on that date. However, to avoid the celebrating on *Shabbat*, it may be commemorated one or two days before or after the 5th of *Iyar* if it falls too close to *Shabbat*. *Yom Hazikaron*, the Israeli Fallen Soldiers and Victims of Terrorism Remembrance Day is always scheduled for the day preceding Independence Day.

This year, Yom Ha'atzmaut will be observed on 8-9 May. At the close of Yom Hazikaron on the evening of the holiday, celebrants, and officials will gather at Mount Herzl, Jerusalem, for a ceremony with speeches and a parade of soldiers that will conclude with the lighting of twelve torches, representing the Twelve Tribes of Israel. Yom Ha'atzmaut is primarily a secular holiday (in fact, most Israelis do not consider Yom Ha'atzmaut a religious holiday at all), and the day is spent enjoying many outdoor activities, including concerts, picnics, barbecues, and fireworks. During the day, families may visit nature reserves, museums, and other attractions which are open to the public free of charge.

Yom Ha'atzmaut also is considered a minor religious holiday, although how it should be observed is less clear, as in Israel there is no real agreement among the Orthodox, Conservative, and Progressive rabbis. On the other hand, our prayer book, Gates of Prayer (Shaarei Tefillah), includes a service for Yom Ha'atzmaut. And for American Jews, celebrating Yom Ha'atzmaut has been a way to express solidarity with the State of Israel and to strengthen their alliance with it.



The Many Commemorations in May and June

Our Ritual Scholar, Suzan Cohen, covered the celebration of *Yom Ha'atzmaut* (העצמאות) on page 2. However, that is just one of several other celebrations in the months of May and June of this year.

Yom HaShoah (יום השואה) will take place on 2 May 2019. This is Holocaust Remembrance Day observed as Israel's day of commemoration for the approximately six million Jews who perished in the Holocaust as a result of the actions carried out by Nazi Germany and its collaborators, and for the Jewish resistance in that period. In Israel, it is a national memorial dav. The first official commemorations took place in 1951, and the observance of the day was anchored in a law passed by the Knesset in 1959.

Yom HaZikaron (יוֹם הַדְּכָּרוֹן) will be on 8 May 2019. It is Memorial Day for the Fallen Soldiers of Israel and Victims of Terrorism. It is Israel's official remembrance day, enacted into law in 1963. While Yom HaZikaron has been traditionally dedicated fallen soldiers, commemoration has also been extended to civilian victims of terrorism.

Jerusalem Day (יום ירושלים) will be celebrated on 2 June 2019. It is is an Israeli national holiday commemorating the reunification of Jerusalem and the establishment of Israeli control over the Old City in the aftermath of the June 1967 Six-Day War. The day is officially marked by state ceremonies and memorial services.

Lag B'Omer (לֵיג בְּעוֹמֶר) will be celebrated on 23 May 2019. It is a minor holiday that occurs on the 33rd day of the Omer, the 49-day period between Passover and Shavuot. A break from semi-mourning of the Omer, key aspects of Lag B'Omer include holding Jewish weddings (it's the one day during the Omer when Jewish law permits them), lighting bonfires and getting haircuts.

Shavuot (שָׁבוּעוֹת) will begin on 8 June 2019. It is known as the Feast of Weeks. It has a double significance. It marks the all-important wheat harvest in Israel and it commemorates the anniversary of the day when God gave the *Torah* to the nation of Israel assembled at Mount Sinai.

The leader of the service will read from a list and then invite the congregation to call out names that are not on this list that is read weekly. New Memorial Plaques




