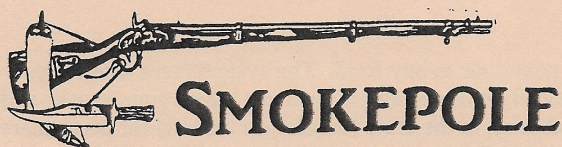

**FRONTIER HERITAGE FAIR:** This is the club's big event and source of income. There is a need for members to be involved. Set-up is on Friday, Feb. 16, when the traders arrive and we hang the event banners, move tables and assist those who need help. Set-up starts by 9 am and goes all day until about 8 pm. The fairgrounds sets out tables and chairs and I get to tweak them in advance but there are always last-minute changes. There will be a club table where we (preferably in period clothing) can interact with the public and answer questions. One very important job is serving at the admission table to greet the public and handle fees and make change with another person to stamp hands and sell raffle tickets. We have raised admission to \$5 which should make the job a little easier. There should be enough volunteers so no one has to work too long without a break. Members serving at the event will wear staff



badges which will allow us to get into the Asian Celebration next door to buy food. The system there uses scrip, which people buy in \$1 increments; food & drink items are priced on the dollar and you can return your unused scrip for a refund. To get into the Asian Celebration, go in the front door, to the table (usually on the left) for performers and volunteers to show your badge. Likewise, staff from the Asian Celebration wearing tags are allowed free admission to our event. There is no shared admission agreement for the public with the Asian Celebration. As a courtesy to that event and our traders and staff I will have copies of their food vendors and choices available. To volunteer or get more information call me at 541-689-4281.

Well, now, look at all this space. I can do a special feature I'll call

#### GRANNY'S CRANNY

Pancakes for breakfast on Sunday morning was a tradition when I was growing up. I would awaken to the sound of the hand-cranked beater going in the kitchen and think "yum – pancakes". I would eat some and on the way to church have a tummy ache. It happened every Sunday. A woman about my age said the same thing would happen to her. Strange. I still have pancakes for Sunday breakfast (except the first Sunday of the month when we go to the Sons of Norway Lodge's pancake breakfast – for lunch) but I don't get a tummy ache and there is a reason.

One secret of great pancakes is using the right ingredients. I also have a recipe that works for any number of people, making the from-scratch pancakes even better. So forget the packaged pancake mix – people have actually gotten sick and even died from eating it after it sat in the cupboard too long. Makes you wonder what is in it.

First, the flour. Consider the commercial white "enriched" stuff. When I learned what it goes through from seed to shelf I stopped buying it. (The same goes for corn oil) I prefer Kamut for pancakes. Like Emmer, it is an ancient grain; the largest available and makes a pale gold flour that tastes good and is very digestible. The smallest grain is Teff, which comes from Africa and is very nutritious. It is available as a tiny grain or flour. I add a little of the grain to pancakes because Bob likes the crunch and I like the nutrient boost. There are other flour options. The thing to remember is always read the label because some "flours" don't work well by themselves and need to be mixed with more traditional products. The best all-purpose flour in my opinion is Bob's Red Mill Organic Stone Ground Whole Wheat. Organic speaks for itself and stone ground products contain fine stone dust which has minerals your body needs. Market of Choice has a great selection of the Red Mill products. If you are interested in a local source of flours, check out Camas Mills, available in some stores and at their retail outlet on Purkerson Road southwest of Junction City. There is a bakery and lunch service, Tuesday-Saturday.

Here is my recipe. For EACH person:

¼ cup flour	1 egg	Beat egg(s) (a wire whisk works well), add milk and oil
1 tsp baking powder	¼ cup milk	Blend dry ingredients and add to the wet ones
dash salt	1 tsp oil	Stir well (note there is no sugar added to this)

I use almond oil which is mild and has an almost sweet taste.

I cook the pancakes on a cast iron griddle (is there any other kind?) which has been heating while I assemble and mix the ingredients. I use real butter on the griddle and do not have butter on the table.

You can be creative with this recipe. Adding pureed pumpkin and using peanut oil and spices is one option. One other is hazelnut flour/meal. Or use buttermilk. Can I make zucchini pancakes?

About syrup etc. – you're not still using that colored sugar water your mother bought, are you? You know about the choices: honey, molasses, sorghum, jams and jellies, fruit syrups and some more exotics. Of course there is the standby maple, spendy but wonderful. It seems the north-easterners who produce the stuff keep the best for themselves and their region and ship the second class stuff out west where we are not supposed to know the difference.... My favorite is Madhava agave syrup with maple. Just plain good.

**DUES ARE DUE:** I'm sorry, I know you are still reeling from Christmas but it is that time of year again. Dues are \$25 for just you or \$35 for couple/family. 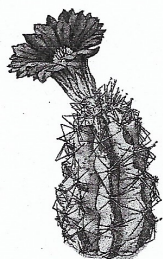

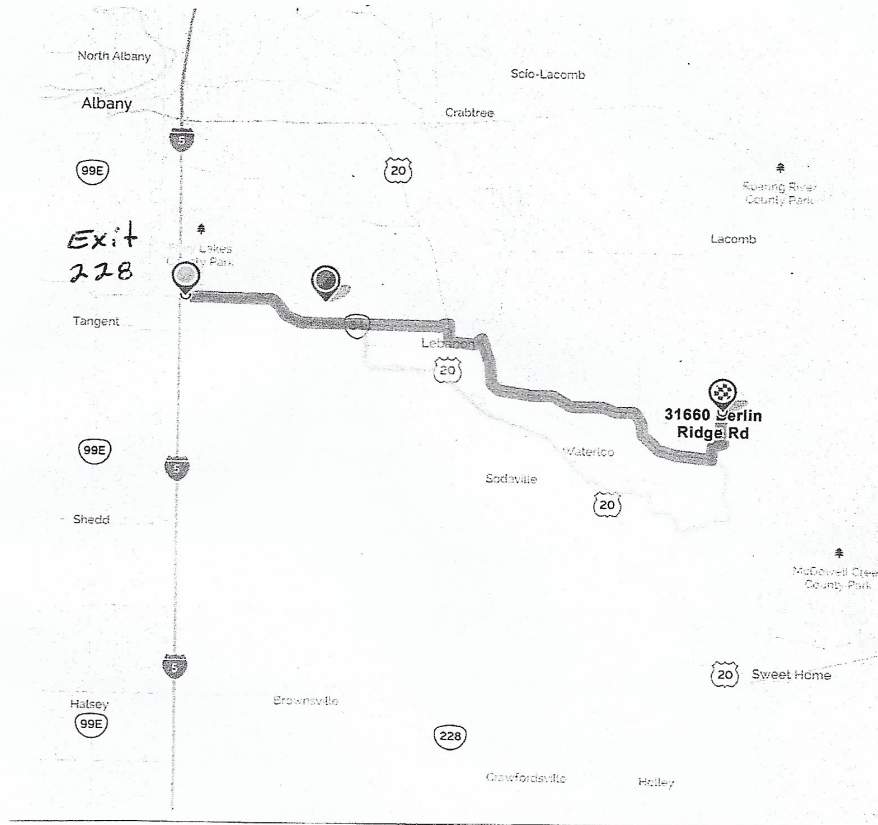
