

(Philippians 1:1b-2.)



the other hand, we can choose to focus on the gifts God has given us.

Take a moment, or two, and look outside your window. Seek God's creation and hold the image in your heart. Give thanks to God for what you see and the blessings of your life.

Another way to help us focus on Jesus is to read our Bibles. Most Christians have a favorite translation. It is ok if you have a 'goto' translation. Community Presbyterian Church decided that they would use the New Revised Standard Version (NRSV) of the Bible as our 'go-to' Bible in the sanc-



Your challenge this month is to put the chaos away and spend some time reading your Bible. We have been focusing on the Gospel of Matthew during Ordinary Time. Matthew contains "Five Discourses" that make up the majority of Matthew. These begin at Matthew 5:1-12 and end at Matthew 25:31-46 and would be a good place to spend time in your Bible.

Let's look at the beginning of the Five Discourses, with Matthew 5:1-12. That passage will likely sound familiar as it is "The Sermon on the Mount" passage. Remember, I mentioned that it can be helpful to read different translations? We are going to look at verse three, the first of Matthew's nine beatitudes (By the way, the Gospel of Luke also has beatitudes, although he only lists four beatitudes. That's something else you could read.). I have included five translations to give you an idea of the differences. You will note that sometimes there is just a difference in punctuation; in other translations, different words are used. You can find the different translations online at www.biblegateway.com

or in our church library!

NRSV (New Revised Standard Version): Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

NKJV (New King James Version): Blessed are the poor in spirit. For theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

CEB (Common English Bible): Happy are people who are hopeless, because the kingdom of heaven is theirs.

The Message: You're blessed when you're at the end of your rope. With less of you there is more of God and his rule.

NLT (New Living Translation): God blesses those who are poor and realize their need for him, for the Kingdom of Heaven is theirs.

Spend some time with several translations and find a couple of others to compare with your favorites. After reading the five translations, did you find differences? Any insights on verse three? Please contact me if you find something that doesn't make sense or you would just like to visit about your Bible study.



This year's designated day for the Fargo -Moorhead CROP Hunger Walk is <u>Sunday</u>, October 4.


