

## **Lena Ena MacCallum**

(August 29, 1921 - February 24, 2011)

Lena Volz MacCallum, age 89, of Sebewaing, passed away Thursday, February 24, 2011.

Lena was born August 29, 1921 near Ubly, MI, to the late John & Bertha Schneider. She was confirmed at St. John Lutheran Church in Berne, MI in June 1936. She worked at Pigeon Farmers Co-op Elevator prior to marrying Clare Volz, son of Gottlieb and Louise Volz, December 25, 1941. Mr. & Mrs. Volz lived on his farm near Sebewaing where they attended Immanuel Lutheran Church. Lena belonged to Mary Martha Guild and Women's Missionary League.
