

“Spiritual Goals for the Church”

Colossians 2:1–5

Intro: What hare goal you had for your children to become when they grew up?

Just as a parent has goals for their children, so the Apostle Paul had goals for the church, especially the Colossian and Laodicean churches.

Scripture:

Colossians 2:1–5 — “¹ For I want you to know how **great a struggle** I have on your behalf and for those who are at Laodicea, and for all those who have not personally seen my face,

Colosenses 2.1–5 — “¹ Porque quiero que sepáis qué **gran lucha tengo** por vosotros y por los que están en Laodicea, y por todos los que no me han visto en persona,

I. Five Goals that the Apostle had for the Church:

A. A strong heart.

² that their hearts may be **encouraged**, having been knit together in love...

² para que sean **alentados** sus corazones, y unidos en amor, ...

1. **“heart”** – it refers to the inner person and the center of life where the thinking and decision takes place.
2. **“Encourage”** – means to come alongside someone to entreat, comfort, exhort, or encourage.

B. Be united in love.

² that their hearts may be encouraged, **having been knit together in love**, ...

² para que sean alentados sus corazones, y unidos en amor, ...

1. A **“heart”** is made strong because it is surrounded by loving relationships.
2. **“Knitting”** requires each thread of yarn to work together and so love must be intentional involvement, closeness, and dependence by bearing one another’s burdens. / 2. **“Tejer”** requiere que cada hilo de hilo trabaje en conjunto y, por lo tanto, el amor debe ser participación intencional, cercanía y dependencia al llevar las cargas de los demás.

C. Settled in the understanding of Christ.

² ... and attaining to all the wealth that comes from the **full assurance of understanding**, ³ in whom are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge. ⁴ I say this **so that no one will delude you with persuasive argument**. ⁵ For

D. Walking in obedience to Christ.

Colossians 2:6–7 — ^{"6} Therefore as you have received Christ Jesus the Lord, **so walk in Him**, ⁷ having been firmly rooted and now being built up in Him and established in your faith, just as you were instructed, **and overflowing with gratitude.**"

Colosenses 2.6–7 — ^{"6} Por tanto, de la manera que recibisteis a Cristo Jesús el Señor, **así andad en Él;** ⁷ firmemente arraigados y edificados en Él y confirmados en vuestra fe, tal como fuisteis instruidos, **rebosando de gratitud.**"

1. **"Walk"** refer to daily conduct – contextually leaning toward their maintaining their correct beliefs about Christ without wavering.
2. Many have walked with God in the Old Testament:
 - a. **Like Enoch - Hebrews 11:5 —** ^{"5} By faith Enoch was taken up so that he would not see death; and he was not found because God took him up; for he obtained the witness that before his being taken up he was pleasing to God." / **Hebreos 11.5 —** ^{"5} Por la fe Enoc fue trasladado al cielo para que no viera muerte; y no fue hallado porque Dios lo trasladó; porque antes de ser trasladado recibió testimonio de haber agrado a Dios."
 - 1) This meant to be please to God
 3. **We become like the one we walk with - Proverbs 13:20 —** ^{"20} He who walks with wise men will be wise, But the companion of fools will suffer harm." / **Proverbios 13.20 —** ^{"20} Él que anda con sabios será sabio, mas el compañero de los necios sufrirá daño."
 4. **Heaven belong to those whose walk is like God's - Psalm 15:1–2 —** ^{"1} O Lord, who may abide in Your tent? Who may dwell on Your holy hill? ² He who walks with integrity, and works righteousness, And speaks truth in his heart." / **Salmo 15.1–2 —** ^{"1} Señor, ¿quién habitará en tu tabernáculo? ¿Quién morará en tu santo monte? ² El que anda en integridad y obra justicia, que habla verdad en su corazón."
 5. **Question:** At what point in the day does your walk with God begin?

E. They would be overflowing in Gratitude -- *and overflowing with gratitude.*"

1. **Gratitude is the essence of worship.**
2. **We are to be grateful in every circumstance - 1 Thessalonians 5:17–19 —** ^{"17} pray without ceasing; ¹⁸ in everything give thanks; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. ¹⁹ Do not quench the Spirit;" / **1 Tesalonicenses 5.17–19 —** ^{"17} orad sin cesar; ¹⁸ dad gracias en todo,

porque esta es la voluntad de Dios para vosotros en Cristo Jesús.
