# 4. Executive Session

- G. International and interstate negotiations and negotiations by a city or town with a tribal council.
- H. Instruction of designated representatives concerning negotiations for the purchase of real property.

#### 5. Discussion and Possible Approval of the Campus Tours & Classroom Visits Policy & Procedure.

Richard Hay provided a brief background and summary of the proposed Campus Tours & Classroom Visits Policy and Procedures. There were no questions or comments from the board. - 6. Discussion and Possible Approval of Adding Richard Hay as an Additional Charter Authorized Representative (ASBCS Charter Amendment).

Richard Hay briefed the board that during the school's virtual site visit for its renewal, ASBCS staff suggested the school add a second charter representative should the school want an additional person to receive notification and the ability to act in the same role as the current charter representative. Mr. Hay explained this was not a requirement but technical guidance provided by the Charter Board staff. Jim Sexton moved to approve the submission of an Additional Charter Representative Amendment for Richard Hay to the Arizona State Board for Charter Schools. Curt Porter seconded the motion.

# 7. Discussion and Possible Approval of a One-Time Instructional Days Charter Amendment Due to the Unusually High Number of Inclement Weather Day this Current School Year (2022/23).

Richard Hay explained that SY 2022/23 has been one of the most challenging years regarding school closures due to inclement weather. The school has already eliminated all non-required holidays to make-up for the snow-days and Curt Porter moved to approve the One-Time Instructional Days Charter Amendment as presented (175 days from 180 days) for SY 2022/23. Jim Sexton seconded the motion. extended the school through the end of May 2023. However, additional snow-days occurred in MArch and the school will need to revise its calendar with ADE again. Therefore, Board Member Hay has calculated the hours and minutes needed to meet state statutes (890 hours for grades 4-8) and has verified via Tyler SIS the school would meet its statutory time requirement with 175 instructional days.

The school's charter contract states the school year will be 180 days. In order to meet the statutory requirements and accommodate the needs of parents and staff, Hay recommends a one-time charter amendment for 175 school days for the current year 2022/23.

The proposed one-time amendment would reflect 137 regular school days at 349 minutes/day; and 38 early release days at 220 minutes/day, for a total of 56,173 minutes = 936.2 hours.
