Attendance: Members present: Fr. Nick Zukowski, Pastor and Rep. from the Parish Finance Council; Christopher Casinelli, at-large member and Chairperson, Jerry Cipkowski, from the Worship Commission; Rocky Mercier, from the Christian Service Commission; Cecilia Lallmann, Youth Rep. Members Absent/Excused: Gary McMenamain, from the Education Commission and Jerome Kunert from the Knights of Columbus, Pius X Council. Both men will be asked to consider becoming our new PPC Chairperson.

Ongoing Formation of the Council: From the USCCB document, “Go and Make Disciples” – Chapter 2, Part 2. Good sharing.

Review of the Minutes: Approved with no corrections needed.

Ongoing Parish Issues

A. Issues for discernment/consensus (Old Business)

1. Building Committee progress report: Hanging material on the interior hallway walls need to be removed to avoid getting dusty. Some concerns over confessional transitions into storage area. Will be resolved.
2. Archdiocesan Synod on the New Evangelization: the following are prep programs for the Synod: Amazing Parish Conference: Fr. Nick and Rocky Mercier shared their reaction to the conference. Lots of input, information to process. Liturgies and talks gave hope for the future of the parish; the Holy Spirit was alive and well! Come, Encounter Christ: Do attend if you have not yet done so. Parish Dialogue Session: took place on April 30th. 38 people in attendance who shared their Encounters with Christ, their Growth in the spiritual life, and how to Witness to others. Very inspiring. The answers to the questions will be passed on to the A o D Synod Committee.
3. Mission Trip to Appalachia progress report: 11-12 people have signed up. Looking for ways to involve the whole parish: daily photo page, prayer teams, etc. The Appeal for clothing and furniture takes place this month.
4. Voices for Equity: this is an A o D advocacy that comes under Christian Service.
5. MCC inspection reports: Larry Lage continues to make progress in fulfilling the recommendations. He has been a great help with the church construction project as well.
6. Catholic Services Appeal (CSA): We are \$13,000 over and above last year’s parish target of \$78,750. 10% of last year’s surplus will go to the K of C persecuted Christians fund for humanitarian relief. This year’s target is \$78,444, which is actually lower than last year’s target. Fr. Nick tried to explain the “magic formula” used to compute targets.

7. Any other Old Business? None brought forward.

B. Issues for discernment/consensus (New Business)

1. Parish Time and Talent Sunday moved from Pentecost of this year to August/September: “Called by Christ, Gifted by the Spirit” is a program developed by the A o D to increase stewardship awareness. This program involves dozens of people, lots of resources and nine months of lead time. We need bulletin articles, bulletin inserts, homilies, lay testimonies and commitment sheets drawn up, distributed, calculated and passed on to the appropriate people. We will have some sort of formal stewardship committal sheet to fill out prior to Pentecost Sunday, 2017. The commitment will be in four areas: time for personal and family prayer; time for activities with the family; time in service and ministry to the parish; and a specific commitment of financial support.
2. Status on part-time Business Manager: We had a candidate agree to come on board, but a last-minute emergency surfaced at her home parish, forcing her to start working there. We are back to Square One in our search.
3. Status on parking lot, telephone system upgrade, and church sound system: The entire parking lot should be repaired, sprayed and striped by mid-June. The telephone and church sound system projects will be top priority in the next fiscal year.

We will do it at our next meeting.

Review of the Minutes: Approved, with the corrected spelling in the minutes and on the agenda of the last names of Margery and Maribeth. Sorry about that, ladies!

Ongoing Parish Issues

A. Issues for discernment/consensus (Old Business)

1. Parish Synod: November 18, 19, 20, 2016: “Unleash the Gospel.” Members share their experiences after attending “**Come Encounter Christ:**” uplifting and energizing; “The Amazing Parish Conference:” Intense, spirit-filled and hope-filled as all parishes are challenged to transition “from Maintenance to Mission.” **Parish Dialogue Sessions:** Facilitator: Margery Fabilli, Note Taker: Kathy Baker; 38 people attended, shared, reflected and were open to the spirit of evangelization. Three participants expressed an interest in joining our committee!
2. Discussion groups for “Rediscover Jesus” (Apr. 25): Good, lively and very personal discussions among the 12 who attended on the relationship between the individual and Jesus, how He helps mend the broken parts of our lives and inspires us to do good things, and how we should never fear to share our faith stories with others. “Beautiful Mercy” will be discussed on Monday, June 6th.
3. Status on Pictorial Directory and Welcome Booklet: The week before and the week of Thanksgiving in November have been chosen for photo sittings. The studio will be in the Teen Room (Classroom One) and the registration area will be the kitchenette. Still waiting for more info for the welcome booklet. Was suggested to go to the web site.

Evangelization Committee Minutes of the May 26, 2016 meeting, P. 2

B. Issues for discernment/consensus (New Business)

1. “Called by Christ, Gifted by the Spirit” Stewardship Awareness Program: Fr. Nick explained the many details of successfully implementing this program. It will begin in our parish after the Synod in November and will conclude with a Festival of Ministries and the filling out and collecting of commitment sheets on Pentecost Sunday. Many folks will be involved in giving personal testimony on how choosing to tithe has blessed their lives and has brought them closer to the Lord and to the Church. Members are asked to let Fr. Nick know who are the tithers in our parish.

2. Any other New Business? A suggestion was made to begin a new form of Bible Study, perhaps using the Little Rock Bible Study series, and perhaps meeting between the two Sunday morning Masses. The current bible study was discussed and evaluated.

3. We were reminded that two items were missing in the minutes from our last meeting’s discussion, so they were brought up at this meeting. We would like Fr. Nick, Sr. Pat and Deacon Marion to share the story of their vocation to the priesthood, to the permanent diaconate and to the consecrated religious life. It will be called “Sharing our Story” and will be put on the parish calendar for some time in the fall. Also recommended was a “Stump the Priest” question-and-answer night where questions are submitted in advance for Fr. Nick to answer. This, too, will be put on the parish calendar, possibly under the title, “Why do Catholics?...”

Summary of Fr. Nick's State of the Parish Message May 15, 2016

The poet William Blake wrote a poem about Pentecost. Part of it says: Unless the eye catches fire, God will not be seen. Unless the ear catches fire, God will not be heard. Unless the tongue catches fire, God will not be named. Unless the heart catches fire, God will not be loved. Unless the mind catches fire, God will not be known.

Since last Pentecost, Archbishop Allen Vigneron has challenged us to "Unleash the Gospel" – to unleash the Gospel in our hearts, in our homes, in our parishes, and in our cities and towns. There is no greater need for us to be on fire than right now! In that Spirit, I present my first ever State of the Parish message. I share with you my observations, my hopes and my vision for us.

More reverence as we are aware of what we do; more participation in song and in responses; a rotating choir schedule, with both the adult choir and the contemporary group enhancing our liturgies.

Reviewed our procedures and training for altar servers, ushers. Lectors and EMHC's, and revised the way we distribute Communion at mass.

Purchased two nativity sets to replace the ones lost during the Great Flood of August, 2014, turning one of them into an evangelization tool as we decorate the outdoor stable for Christmas, Lent and Easter. We continue to replace any flood-destroyed items as time goes by.

Funeral services include an expanded wake service and scriptural rosary, and a participation sheet to encourage more participation at the funeral home.

Fr. Michael Sullivan led us in a Fall retreat, and we updated our Mass prayer cards with the Gloria and the Creed, and updated the contemporary songbook. The Ushers purchased electronic song boards and are revising their procedures. Three of the old, unused confessionals have been converted into much-needed storage closets.

The Pope Pius X Council of the Knights of Columbus coordinated and partially sponsored the new Stations of the Cross, which once hung at St. Leonard Parish in Warren.

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With the financial assistance of the ACWC, we purchased funeral vestments, communion cups and a new papal flag.

Installed new handrails in the church sanctuary and are in the middle of upgrading and expanding our church restroom facilities.

Installed new parish center doors, and upgraded the sidewalks at the parish center. We are working on having handicap automatic door openers installed at the main entrance of the church and over at the parish center. We also plan to upgrade and stripe our parking lot this summer.

We will evaluate three important elements that impact our Sunday worship: the quality of our liturgical music, the quality of the means and the message delivered through the homily, and the quality of our hospitality to all who come to worship. We will do this.

Our “Rallying Cry” is our mission statement: Strive, celebrate and serve.

Openness and hospitality has welcomed others from closed parishes. Over 300 of our households within the past three years are in transition from other parishes. We are in the process of preparing a parish pictorial directory so that everyone can put names with faces. It should come out in 2017, which is the 55th anniversary of the founding of our parish, and the 50th anniversary of the dedication of this church.

We have recovered totally from the Great Flood of August, 2014, which occurred shortly after my arrival as your new pastor. Most of the items that were damaged beyond repair have been replaced so far without costing us a cent. We received a generous compensation check from the insurance company.

Fr. Nick met with each staff member at St. Martin de Porres to get their take on their position on the staff, their ministry in the parish, and the needs of their specific department. We are addressing those needs in a slow but deliberate process. The chief concerns expressed by the staff are: meeting the needs of our aging parishioners; finding and welcoming younger families and

youth to our parish; a thirst for educational and inspiring homilies at Sunday and weekday Mass; and adult formation opportunities to grow in our Catholic faith.

2016 State of the Parish, P. 3

Many of these concerns are already being addressed. We are reaching out to the unchurched and the fallen-away Catholics with gifts at Christmas and Easter: Gus Lloyd's A Minute in the Church, volumes 1 and 2, and two of Matthew Kelly's books: "Rediscover Christ" and "Beautiful Mercy." We have developed a web site and keep it current. Check us out at smdeporres.com!

Upcoming funerals, notices and events are posted on the front page of the web site, along with a seasonal message from me.

We increased the number of adult education and formation opportunities with Bible study and a series on Mary, the Mother of Jesus. Our Parish Pastoral Council, Parish Finance Council and all commissions are now functioning fully and expanding in their membership and in their vision of evangelization/outreach. We added faith-sharing and ongoing formation topics at each meeting, so that it is not just about agenda items and reports.

We updated our parish policy on baptisms, weddings and funerals. We are updating our parish handbook – still a work in progress -- and have created more efficient budgets and financial accountability and transparency in all of our departments of service and ministry. We tithe a percentage of our parish income as our outreach. We provide now an annual financial statement. Our financial support of outreach charities is both staggering and inspiring.

Improved communication between pastor and parishioners and among the parish staff. Fr. Nick's weekly column is the most frequent avenue of communication, to keep you aware of what is happening. E-mail, personal contact and monthly pastoral team meetings to rely on staff input, expertise and wisdom.

All of these great things have happened through the blessing and grace of God, the patronage of St. Martin de Porres, and your prayerful and financial support. Thank you for being responsible and generous stewards!

So we can say this with confidence: "For all that has been, we thank You

Lord; for all that will be, we say YES!” Let’s catch the Spirit. Let’s catch the Fire.
Let’s catch the power! Let’s unleash the Gospel! AMEN! ALLELUIA!

Go and Make Disciples – Part Five – Our Goals

ONGOING PARISH LIFE

a. Old Business

1. The church restroom renovation project has begun. Due to a testing delay, it is behind schedule. The current women's restroom is available on the weekends and the men are using the restroom in the priest's sacristy. It looks like the whole project will not be completed until mid to late June.
2. Some of those who attended the Parish Synod Gathering shared their reflections about that gathering. They felt it was spirit-filled and informative.
3. The Time and Talent Festival of Ministries is being postponed until 2017 and will be at the conclusion of the "Called by Christ Gifted by the Spirit" Stewardship Program which will begin in the fall. We are looking for suggestions of people to contact who already are embracing stewardship in their lives and would be willing to give witness as part of the occasional weekend homilies when the program begins. Fr. Nick would preach and then introduce the stewards.
4. A pilgrimage to the Holy Doors at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral is still being discussed. More information is needed, and details will be available in the parish bulletin.

b. New Business

1. For this year's feast of Corpus Christi (May 29) we will have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament after the Sunday 8:30 AM Mass, continuing with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until 10:45 AM, and concluding with Benediction prior to the start of the 11:00 AM Mass. We invite everyone to stay for a period of adoration after the 8:30 Mass or to come early for the 11:00 Mass to pray before the Eucharistic Lord.
2. See #3 under Old Business.
3. Our parish offices will be closed on Memorial Day. We are looking at the possibility of having a 9:30 Mass in church that day, since it is already available for the previous two days.
4. With funerals being celebrated at our neighboring churches during our construction, we are making available all funeral notices on our parish website.

5. Plans are underway for a Parish Pictorial Directory. This will coincide with our parish's 55th anniversary in 2017. It is hoped that we can do this every five years so we will be able to put names to the faces we see. We hope to schedule that in November this year. In addition, in 2017,

6. The parish mission trip to Appalachia is scheduled for July 31 to August 5. Twelve volunteers will be going. In the near future, information will be given to the entire parish about this trip and we hope to have prayer partners so the entire parish can be involved.

7. A question came up from a couple of members of the Parish Pastoral Council at their last meeting as to why we no longer "dress the altar" or use the hymn "We Come to Your Feast" at First Communion Mass and at the Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper. There is nothing in the rubrics that address dressing the altar. The custom came after Vatican II and was often used so more people could be involved in the liturgy. Given the size of our oversized altar, it is not practical. In addition, when invited to a banquet, the guests are not expected to dress the table; and so at Mass, it is more fitting that the altar be ready when Mass begins. An article about "dressing the altar" will be published in the bulletin at some future time. The hymn "We Come to Your Feast" is a traditional favorite and can be used but probably only verses 2 and 3. There are many other Eucharistic hymns and when the children's choir is present they often sing these at the Offertory.

8. A suggestion was made that upcoming events from the Archdiocese be published in our bulletin and on our website as well as put in the announcements so more parishioners would be aware of what is available and what events are upcoming.
