LETTER FROM PASTOR AMY

Dear Church,

When I was younger, my mom would plan these open ended trips. The plan was for the whole family to pile into the car and just go, with the hopes that we would have adventures along the way. Getting lost was not to be feared, because my mom always not so secretly hoped that it would happen. I remember the sounds of the road, of my parents talking, and of looking out the window with my sister as we played road games and read books. It was not always smooth sailing. At least one time we were stopped by the police for speeding, and occasionally we would have to stop to change a flat tire, or an argument would break out about which road to take, but in the end, we were a family together, traveling to

new places and seeing new things. I grew so much closer to my family through these trips. The journey was more important than the destination and I always knew that my mom would get us back home in the end. Lent in and of itself is a journey. It reminds us of Jesus' forty days in the wilderness, fasting and leaning on God while at the same time being tempted by Satan. As we get closer and closer to Jesus' crucifixion, death, and resurrection, we ourselves are making the journey to the cross. We are following Jesus' commandment to take up our own cross. Many of us are making sacrifices during this time to do less of something that keeps us from experiencing the joy of our journey with God. We repent that we have not been the people God creates

us to be, but in doing so we embrace the hope of the resurrection.

It has been a difficult time to be United Methodist lately. As I am writing this, we are still three days away from General Conference. But for you, Church, you have seen the results. Know that General Conference is only part of our journey together with God. We are His people, called together to be the body of Christ, in times of peace and in times of conflict. I pray that we as a church are finding our way to be a family as we continue this journey together and trust that God's hands are on every single part of our lives.
