There's only one way to start this newsletter, after the customary apology for its lateness, and that's with the superlative performance of Harriers Robin Carter and Matt Tomlinson in the Dragon's Back race in late May.

THE DRAGON'S BACK RACE

If any race deserves the name Endurance Event, this is it. It started on the North Wales coast at Conwy Castle and, 5 days later, finished at Llandeilo near Carmarthen, a distance of 315km (196 miles to old imperialists like me). In between, it crossed all the biggest bumps in the landscape and climbed 15,500m (51,000 feet).

In a world-class field of 400 runners Robin and Matt finished 11th equal out of 251 finishers, an incredible achievement. Their total time was 45 hours. The winner was Canadian Galen Reynolds (37:48), nearly an hour ahead of Briton Jim Mann in 2nd, and a further hour ahead of third placed Robert Barnes.

Matt's comment: "A 5 day, all you can eat, holiday with my best mate. What more could you ask for?" Robin has promised to write "a bit of a report over the next few weeks before the memories and blisters subside!" I'm sure Steve Leach will be including it in the Epics section of the website.

LONDON MARATHON

Unfortunately for Ben Kirby he was unable to take up the Derby RSPCA entry, as announced in the last newsletter, but Chris Clarke stepped in and crossed the line in a time of 3:34:37, raising £1,367 for the RSPCA in the process. Our other two runners finished very close to each other (not sure if they knew that at the time). Steve Roebuck's time was 4:21:36 and Andy Norman, whose name was drawn out of the hat for the guaranteed club place was just behind Steve in 4:22:54.

Here's Steve's summary of the day:

"I was pleased with my time for my first ever marathon. Definitely hit the wall around mile 20 and the amazing crowd had to push me along the last few miles. When I turned the last corner and saw the finish line the feeling was indescribable. A very emotional and proud moment which will stick with me for a long time. I also raised over £1,700 (including gift aid) for 2 charities close to my heart (Motor Neurone Disease Association and Mind (Mental Health Charity).

I'm still undecided as to whether that will be my one and only marathon!!"


THE FELLSMAN 2019

The Fellsman is described on its website as "a high level traverse covering more than 60 miles over very hard rugged moorland. The event climbs over 11,000 feet in its path from Ingleton to Threshfield in the Yorkshire Dales."

Ideal training, then, for someone planning to race the Dragon's Back three weeks later. Just what club captain Robin carter thought, and how right he was! To add to the challenge, Storm Hannah was wreaking havoc throughout the kingdom on the first day of this nominally two-day event (for runners and walkers). Robin made light of that situation: "Thankfully the conditions were mixed rather than terrible all day, with a bit of a tailwind in places. Ground was a bit soggy on the surface, but mostly good." To cut a long story short, in a field of 321 starters, only 220 finished, and Robin was 3rd. His time was 11hrs 59mins, 41 minutes behind the winner. And, under the new scoring system, he scored 24 out of a maximum of 25 points in the club championship.

Also taking part were Pete Adams and his son Jonathan, who completed the course together in 24hrs and 40mins.

FELL AND ULTRA SCORING
