

Great Northern 2019

Our last Great Northern tour was in 2017 and its reputation brought together nearly 87 people and 45 cars to once again get on the road in 2019. A group of Model A ers found their way to Osceola Wisconsin and joined up into a caravan thru some drizzle and rain on the way to Spooner for lunch. Our first scheduled stop was at the Burnett Diary complex which has a beautiful shop that has cheese, ice cream, candy, coffee and good snacking that you can pick up for a road trip. One of our members had an unscheduled stop right before this and he picked up a chicken, and it wasn't crossing the road. Dave Peterson gave the chicken the first ride due to a leaking radiator petcock. Well it seems appropriate that the chicken knows about a petcock. On to Spooner for lunch and more people joining the group for the ride into Hayward. We settled into the Hayward Holiday Inn and got acquainted with some of the first timers on the trip and looked over each other's cars hoping that the morning would bring us some sunshine and fall colors on our first outing.

Day one. Not so much sun and at times not too dry but we had an interesting visit to the North Country Shrimp Farm. A hardworking diary farming husband and wife are raising shrimp in the rolling countryside of Wisconsin to offset the downturn in the diary business. It seemed like a biology lab and science class rather than a farm. Extremely controlled climate, building space, water temperature and food sourcing get these shrimp from almost microscopic to 20 to the pound size on your dinner plate. We continued on our way to a country meat market /cheese shop for road snacks and then we had a home cooked buffet meal at a local tavern and if that wasn't enough onward thru beautiful back roads to a local winery who put on a tasting of the seasonal wines.

Day two. It was a long drive to see the St. Croix Rod Factory where the group was given a guided tour of the process of crafting fine fishing rods. Some of the group decided to forgo this tour and explore a little closer to Hayward but regroup to a club favorite destination the stately Garmish lodge. We were warmly welcomed and filled to capacity the dining room. The beautiful timber lodge overlooking the lake with the excellent food gave us all time to enjoy the meal and each other's company. For a fleeting moment before lunch we saw a little sun, but the rain decided to stay around as we headed back to the hotel.

Day Three. Seems we all got a little lazier and the day started a little later as there were options open to consider. The cranberry harvest was in season and some chose to visit a market that was selling fresh harvested cranberries and packaged craisins on the grounds of the cranberry bog, while others slept in or visited the local antique and retail shops around town. A second option was a journey to a local distillery that used local grown crops to create vodka and there was also some tasting going on. While all were away a catered dinner was planned for that night. A local chef has a self-contained portable meat smoking trailer that was set up at the hotel and was running for nearly 7 hours in the parking lot. The smoking oven was finally opened and extremely tender chicken and ribs were brought to the table with all the side dishes for a truly delicious dinner with a great group of people. We recounted the good times on this Great Northern and a few of the typical breakdowns, flat tire, point gaps, condensers, fuel contamination, replacing a water pump, distributor replacement and various little gremlins that a simple pliers or screwdriver can take care of.

When installing the small C-clip on the end of the horn rod, use an old wooden yardstick or something similar up at the steering wheel end to hold the horn button down. Slip the yardstick under the wheel on one side, go over the horn button, then gently flex the yardstick and slip the end under the steering wheel on the opposite side. The yardstick will hold the rod down while you work at the other end, pushing up on the spider against the spring, and inserting the C-clip keeper.




