· You are responsible for decorating your tree. Let your imagination run wild a bit. Theme trees are great, but not required and there are lots of fun ideas out there so feel free to be truly creative. You will need to provide your own tree skirt (if you wish one) decorations, lights and extension cord. Bring a ladder and any other tools necessary to complete your tree. Participants are required to set up and tear down their tree at the designated dates and times.

(if you are not able to tear down at the designated time an additional \$50 fee will be charged and decorations forfeited.)
