Paul will be in a different committee in a different meeting time. This year GA 225 is splitting the sections. I will be in Louisville from Wednesday, June 29, through Sunday, July 3. My committee is Group 4. We will be working with Ministry Coordination, Vision, General Assembly Policies and Procedures, and Financial Resources. I have been doing a fair amount of reading as you might expect as I get ready for my tasks. After I return from Louisville, I will be part of worship and the plenary sessions, where all is being done via Zoom. Please keep all of the people involved with the General Assembly in your prayers. This is an exciting time, and I am grateful for the op-

portunity. As we look forward to summer, other people are experiencing very difficult times. There were two shootings recently, both where the shooters came in with the intention to kill. On Saturday May 14 at the Tops Supermarket in Buffalo, New York, there were 11 people killed. The person who was responsible had come specifically to kill people that were different from him.

Then on Sunday May 15, in California, that same weekend, members of the Irvine Taiwanese Presbyterian Church and Geneva Presbyterian Church in Laguna Woods, California were having lunch on Sunday and one person was killed while five were injured.

The intent for those who went to Buffalo, New York and Luganda Woods, California was to kill people they do not like, those the gunmen wanted to get rid of. Those who survived were traumatized by the shootings, as we would expect.

The question for all of us is, "How many more lives must be lost? How much more blood must be shed before the voices of hate are silenced?" We feel quite sheltered here in the Cass County area where we often hear the news and feel bad, and then we go on living our

> lives as if nothing were different. I am struggling with that and wonder if you are too.

> > We are Christians...what is it that God is calling us to do in this time and in this place?

Please pray for the victims and their families and for those in the communities who will need to work to heal the

wounds. Help us all find words to comfort and reassure people. Let us pray for all those who were impacted by the chaos and those who have lost members of their family and friends.

#### CREATIVE LEARNING PRESCHOOL TO DISCONTINUE LEASE

In April, CPC was notified



by Mandi Radcliffe that she was going to exit her lease for her preschool. She has rented space from CPC for nearly 20 years. Mandi and her predecessors collectively have used our Fellowship Hall for more than 30 years. She said she loves working with our church, but it was time for her to sell the business or discontinue the preschool altogether. At the time of this writing, it is not known if Mandi will be able to sell the preschool, but for sure, she will not be continuing her lease in the fall.

While we are sad to see her go, this also will result in a loss of income for the church which annually amounts to \$6,750. Over the summer we will begin to solicit new renters. 
#### CLEARWATER FOREST FOR GROWN-UPS


