SUNDAY OF ASSESSMENT REPORT October 29, 2017

1. What do you see as the role of the church in the community?

As we look to the future, the role of the church in the community is to be a gathering place; a place of refuge, inspirations, and Jesus's beacon in the community. We should increase the church's exposure in the community by placing an ad or article in the local paper about our Christmas program as other churches have done.

2. What is the role of the church as a family?

The role of the church as a family should include being a place of support in times of joy and in times of need; it should feel like the church "has my back". The church should be a community we get together and help each other. The pastoral care committee's visits to shut-ins and others could be expanded.

It was noted that the church should be more than the "Red Cross" in responding to needs, but be more aggressive in looking for ways to help and be proactive in using the resources we have. Saying "give us a call when you need help" doesn't always work because folks won't always reach out for help. Perhaps we could have group of people that are organized in ways to address needs. The question was raised of how to reach the "non-engaged" when they don't know what is offered. It was suggested we revisit "Bring a friend to Church Sunday" and continue to reach out to others.

3. How do we serve members and friends?

In serving our members and friends we should continue social gatherings. Possibly we could increase luncheons to once a month. We could make "Thinking of you" calls to folks who aren't present at worship.

In response to the question about how we follow up with first time visitors, we found out the office administrator, Victoria, sends out a follow up letter. The observation was offered that having folks in the pews may not be the answer to the question "How do we serve God?" Perhaps the need is more to address how to develop a personal relationship with God for those outside our services.

4. How do we best use out resources to remain vital in the community?

Regarding how do we best use our resources to remain vital in the community, we should support the building and keep it in good repair. This seems to be our best resource at this time as many different groups use the building. The question was raised about reaching out to those who are in these groups. It was suggested to improve communications and follow up with the groups using the building. It was noted that due to the nature of some groups such as AA and NA contact is not allowed.

We should make sure that the police and fire departments are aware there is space to help with their food drives and check on help for the food pantry. Pastor Mark provided a brief explanation of the rent and utility assistance program of the Pastors' association.

Peggy Lohnes gave a brief financial report. We have a good investment manager and our funds are in good shape at this time.

<u>5. What is your vision for this church in the</u> future?

Concerning visions for our church in the future, we need to think outside the box for ways to serve church and community. The traditional church is perceived differently by society today. We could consider the possibility of teaming with other churches for services and music, etc. We should continue serving the homebound and shut-ins. We need to consider young and middle -aged people and what is our part in their future and their part in our future.
