





Our Purpose and Objectives

- To increase access to social services and counseling services.

The SCRC was started in 2010 in response to the growing need to help residents find and utilize social services. Shippensburg falls between the counties of Franklin and Cumberland which means that services can be difficult for community members to access if the services extend to Shippensburg at all. The Resource Coalition has brought service providers and community members together since this time, with the aim of connecting clients with resources as well as developing programs to meet needs.

The SCRC is a Shippensburg University Center For Excellence and serves as a "learning lab" for the university. Students, Faculty, and staff are involved in our work and have initiated many of our programs and services. We also provide a bridge for building community-university relationships. The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings w/your children

Here at our parish, we are transitioning away from Children's Liturgy of the Word during the Mass, and instead, we would like to encourage parents to discuss the weekly readings or homily with their children either before or after Mass occurs. This spiritual conversation, even if it is simple or a bit scattered, can be very powerful, and it is a way for God's word to come alive in our hearts. We will provide questions and discussion points to help parents start this conversation with their children, and please consider doing this with your family each week!



We are celebrating the second Sunday of Lent. What great feast are we getting ready to celebrate? When Jesus rose, he brought light and a life that is stronger than death and he shares this light and life with us. We spend this time during Lent to prepare ourselves for it. How are you preparing for Easter?

In today's Gospel Jesus prepares his friends. He takes his best friends, Peter, James and John, up a mountain. (Important things happen with God on a mountain). For the Jewish people, mountains were holy places where the earth and the heavens almost touch. Jesus was revealing to his friends that when heaven and earth come close, he is the bridge between them. What are some other important things in the Bible that happened on a mountain?

Here Jesus is Transfigured (or changed). Jesus' face began to shine and his clothes became dazzlingly white. How would you have felt is you had seen Jesus' transfiguration? Imagine you have your eyes closed for a long time. You then open your eyes and a very bright flashlight shines in your eyes. His friends saw Jesus not as himself but transfigured in glory. The disciples see Jesus talking to Moses, who gave the Jews the Law of God (Ten Commandments) and Elijah, one of God's greatest prophets. As the disciples watched, a cloud came over them and the voice of God says, "This is my chosen Son; listen to Him". This frightened the disciples. It wouldn't be until Jesus rose from the dead that the apostles could understand what happened at the Transfiguration.



Living our Faith: Remember how Jesus' light was so bright and let your faith shine like that. Be the Light of Christ to everyone you come in contact with this week.
