President's Message

Our Spring, Summer and Fall Season is now over and here we are going into winter. With the help of the Special Assessment, I'm so excited that

we have accomplished so much this season.

Here's what we did:

- created a beautiful barn-looking shed behind the A building (without the grill and picnic table by request of homeowners)
- put gravel on all the parking areas, plus fixed the water run-off problem at the F and G parking area and fixed the standing water problem at the clubhouse parking area
- repaired a water leak at the B building
- put in water cut-off valves for the D and E buildings
- replaced rotted shingles that were falling off the side of the G and H buildings
- replaced the buckling siding on the lower half side of the H building
- installed new posts for the stability of buildings in all buildings except A, which did not require it as it is only two stories
- stabilized the back deck of the K building, as well as repaired holes in the pavement of this building
- repaired soffits in the back of the D and F buildings to prevent water leakage into units
- installed new stairs at the clubhouse and between the D and E buildings coming down to Village Road
- Work continues on repairing the sliding glass doors.
 We've repaired 11 units and have 10 units left.
 These will be completed over the winter season.

Treasurer's Report

At the time of this Newsletter, Holiday Beech has \$5660.00 in delinquent fees. Due to the foreclosures of units D111 and E317, \$3750.00 is included in that delinquent amount, which is, unfortunately, unrecoverable. To-date there is no information on the foreclosure of these two units, but we have our attorney looking into the matter.

As of this time in November we have received \$53,976.70 for the Special Assessment, leaving 45,523.30 due.

You will be receiving individual year-end reports at the start of January. Renée will be putting together reports for each homeowner including how much they've paid in 2009. To save money these reports will be sent via e-mail to those homeowners that have e-mail addresses listed with Holiday Beech. All others will be sent through the U.S. Postal Service. If you want yours to be sent by U.S. Postal Service, please contact Renée.

If throughout 2009 Holiday Beech Villas has sent you a letter saying that your payment was late, a \$10 late fee for the first month and a \$25 fee for each consecutive month, was charged to your account. Holiday Beech Villas keeps record of which Homeowner still owe late fees. Also included in the end-of-year report will be late payments owed to Holiday. Beech Villas.

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Fire Extinguishers

A letter went out to all the rental agencies on Beech from the Town Inspector, Stan Hanna. This letter basically said that ALL rental units are required to have, by Town and State Fire Ordinances, a smoke detector, carbon monoxide detector and a fire extinguisher.

All our units have smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors, but they do not have fire extinguishers. Here are the requirements for fire extinguishers:

- 1-4.5 pound fire extinguisher within easy view and readily accessible
- The gauge should be checked for proper charge
- The pin should be checked for proper use
- The hose nozzle should be checked for blockage
- Date of manufacture and/or maintenance should be checked
- Extinguishers should be serviced (dry chemical replaced) every six years and hydrostatically tested every 10 years. Metal-valved extinguishers can be readily refilled. Plastic-valved extinguishers present a problem when refilling.

Holiday Beech Villas is HIGHLY recommending that ALL units have fire extinguishers. Even though there are fire extinguishers on the outside of the buildings, it is ALWAYS safer to have these extinguishers within your unit.

According to the 2009 North Carolina Fire Code, Section 106.1 Inspection authority. The fire code official is authorized to enter and examine any building, structure, marine vessel, vehicle or premises for the purpose of enforcing this code. That means in ALL rental units.
