Sunday Reflection: First Sunday of Lent

Lent is the annual preparation for Easter observance, calling us to reform our lives and to open our hearts to the blessings God has promised to bestow on us. Lent begins Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Thursday evening when the Triduum begins. According to the Church's Canon Law, all healthy Catholics from age 18 to 59 are

required to fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, and to abstain from meat on all other Fridays of Lent. Fasting is a bodily way to remind ourselves that we need God above all things. Fasting is also a sacrifice, a gift back to God of our heart's intent to depend more completely on God.

The three main Lenten disciplines are prayer, fasting and almsgiving. We are invited during Lent to practice these disciplines often. These Lenten basic practices are rooted in Jesus' original guidance about how to be his disciples that we find in the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew Chapters 5-7). The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#1966-1972) also reminds us that Jesus outlines for us the new law which, if we embrace and implement it, will lead us more surely to the interior renewal and growth in holiness and perfection that Jesus expects of us as his disciples. Today, let us reflect prayerfully about our Lenten resolutions before making them. Then make ourselves a list. But be modest. We may be setting ourselves up for disappointment if we set unrealistic goals. And doing a little with love and devotion is spiritually more beneficial than trying to do much but doing it halfheartedly. I wish you all a graceful and blessed Lenten season.

Saint of the Week: St. Casimir of Poland

Born the third of thirteen children in 1461, Casimir was a prince of Poland. From birth his life was destined to cement his father's authority and increase Poland's power. However, Casimir realized at an early age that his life belonged to a much higher King than his father. Despite pressure, humiliation, and rejection, he stood by that loyalty his whole life.

For Casimir, the riches around him were temptations to forget his true loyalties. Rebelling against the rich, he wore the plainest of clothes and even rejected ordinary comforts. He slept little, spending his nights in prayer. When he did sleep, he laid on the floor instead of a bed.

Casimir's father had him lead an army to take over the throne of Hungary, and while Casimir

felt it was wrong, he obeyed his father. When soldiers started deserting, he was happy to return home. His father, however, was furious at being deterred from his plans and banished Casimir to a castle in Dobzki, hoping that imprisonment would change his mind. Casimir's commitment to what he believed only grew stronger in his exile and he refused to cooperate with his father's plans any more. He participated in his true King's plans instead by praying, studying, and helping the poor.

Casimir died at the age of 23 from lung disease. His favorite song, a Latin hymn to Mary called "Omni die dic Mariae" which we know as "Daily, Daily Sing to Mary." is known as the Hymn of St. Casimir. He is the patron saint of Poland and Lithuania.

Required Safe Environment Training

A reminder to all those required to be Safe Environment certified that your training needs to be completed by March 1. The training includes electronic acknowledgment of three diocesan policies, completion of online video training, and an application for a background check. It should take less than 30 minutes to complete all the steps.

You may be thinking that you don't teach CCD classes so you don't need to complete the training. That is not the case! If you volunteer for our parish, in most all cases you need to be trained (catechists, lectors, adult altar servers, extraordinary ministers, greeters, cantors and choir members, eucharistic ministers to the nursing home and homebound, Knights of Columbus, Ladies Guild members).

We are grateful and fortunate that so many of you take an active role in serving God and our parish. Thank you for taking a few minutes to ensure our compliance in this important program.


