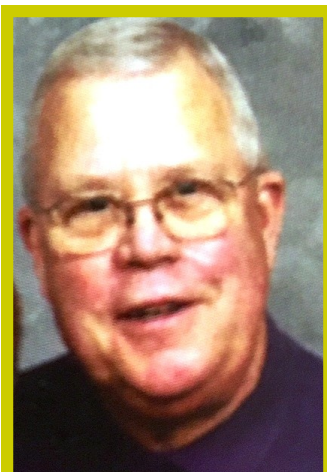

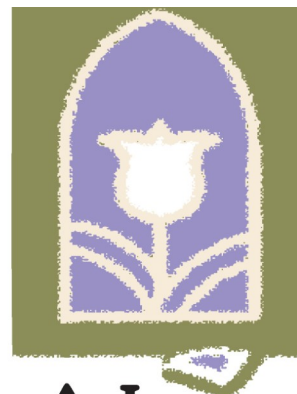
Jeff Reid

Endowment Committee Holds Quarterly Meeting

The Endowment Fund Committee of St. Stephen held its quarterly meeting on July 17. The committee reports the balance of the fund on March 31, 2018 was \$269,469.87 and the ending balance as of June 30, 2018 was \$272,571.59 resulting in a period gain of \$3,101.72 (about 1.2 percent). Dividends and interest earned for this quarter were \$2,160.63. One grant in the amount of \$2,000.00 was disbursed to Family Promise in this quarter and the current amount of funds available for distribution is \$7,440.11.

Acceptance of Minutes:

Michael LaMantia as accepted the position for Scout Liaison as Jane Koch will longer be able to continue.

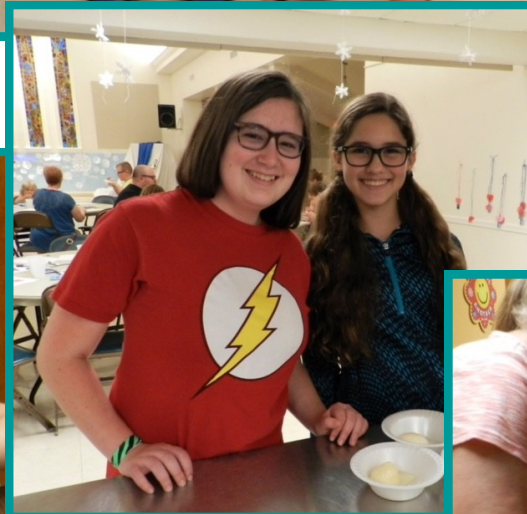

Bulldog Bags Update

This Stow community program has been providing a “bridge of nutrition” (food provided to supplement the resources of families experiencing financial difficulties) to school children since 2015. The program provides a bag of breakfast and lunch items to eligible school children (K-8) on a monthly basis. St. Stephen has provided a driver to deliver the bags every month since the inception of the program three years ago.

In the 2017-2018 school year, Bulldog Bags delivered 5,289 bags of food at a cost of \$3.15 per bag, which totaled 21,094 pounds of food delivered at no cost to the families.

The program has been so well received by the schools, local businesses, and community as a whole that it is has been able to grow in many ways this year. This summer Bulldog Boxes (a means of providing food during the summer months) were provided monthly to eligible families, next school year the program will expand to include eligible ninth graders, and the program has been so successful that delivery will now be twice a month.

St. Stephen is once again looking for volunteers to help with this wonderful community service program. What do you need to do to volunteer? A Bulldog Bag delivery driver needs two things: 1) to be available on the delivery morning for about 30-45 minutes to pick up the bags at City Hall and deliver them to a Stow school and 2) a vehicle (truck or SUV) large enough to accommodate the large plastic bins which hold the bags.

A volunteer sign-up sheet will be posted outside the Narthex with this year’s delivery dates. St. Stephen has been able to provide drivers for the past three years and we want to continue our support of this program to help our very own neighbors here in the City of Stow.
