#### **Honoring a Legendary Coach**



On February 24th at the JMA Dome, Assemblyman Magnarelli and Senator John Mannion presented former Syracuse University Men's Basketball Head Coach Jim Boeheim with a Resolution from the New York State Legislature honoring him for 'Jim Boeheim Day', at the SU vs. Notre Dame game, to celebrate the coaching career of a legend in Syracuse Athletics. Coach Boeheim began his storied career at Syracuse as a player from 1962-1966, playing alongside his friend, and fellow legend, Dave Bing. Boeheim was an assistant coach under Roy Danforth in the mid-1970's before taking over the coaching helm in the fall of 1976 and coaching the next 47 seasons of Syracuse Men's Basketball. With over 1,000 wins, 5 Final Fours and the 2003 National Championship, no other coach has had the success and the longevity in one position continuously for 50+ years as has Jim Boeheim at Syracuse University. Former players, coaches, friends and family were on hand to honor Coach Boeheim, including his lifelong friend, and former Mayor of Detroit, Dave Bing.

## Standing with the Sea of Orange





Assemblyman Bill Magnarelli stood with more than 600 local highway workers representing 1,600 local highway departments who gathered at the state Capitol to request \$250 million in restorations and new funding be included in New York's 2024-25 final budget plan.

Flanked by the perennial "Sea of Orange"—local highway workers from across the state wearing safety orange-colored shirts—the Assemblyman cited an historic 58 percent increase in highway construction costs that have impacted highway departments in just the last 30 months.

Local highway departments maintain 87% of New York's 97,000 miles of highways and more than half of the state's 8,600 highway bridges. The Governor's Executive proposal called for \$100 million in cuts to key funding areas. Assemblyman Magnarelli is calling for those cuts to be restored and for an additional \$150 million to be added as new funds to help address the construction cost increases.

#### **Helping with our Conservation Efforts**

Assemblyman Magnarelli met with representatives from the Onondaga County Soil and Water Conservation District visiting Albany for the NYS Association Conservation Districts' lobby day. They were visiting to advocate for additional funding for our soil and water districts to help them with projects to prevent water pollution, protect our soil and keep local farms productive.



### 2024 Survey Results Are In!

Assemblyman Magnarelli is pleased to provide the survey results mailed out in February to every household in the 129th Assembly District. Below are the tabulated responses from the 1,095 surveys received. The results are tabulated to reflect the overall responses received from constituents residing in the City of Syracuse, Town of Geddes and Town of Van Buren. These percentages may not add up to 100% because some respondents did not answer every question. As always, Assemblyman Magnarelli thanks his constituents for taking the time to answer the survey and share their opinions on these critical matters of importance.

It does this by removing the requirement in law that natural gas hookups be provided to every building that requests it and removes subsidies currently provided to cover the cost of new natural gas hookups.

To this day, South Salina Street is renamed 'Nancy Duffy Lane' every St. Patrick's season in March in her memory.

#### **Headed Towards a Conclusion**

Assemblyman Magnarelli was Co-Chair of the Transportation Joint Budget Conference Subcommittee. Made up of both Assembly and Senate members, this committee meets after both the Senate and Assembly have released their one-house budget proposals and begin negotiations with the Governor on a final budget agreement. Assemblyman Magnarelli, as Assembly Transportation Chair, led the hearing along with his Senate Transportation Chair colleague, Senator Tim Kennedy of Buffalo.
