# ❖ Take Gold Award "A" training

\*After completing this training, complete the following prerequisites.

#### Prerequisites:

#### GIRL SCOUT GOLD LEADERSHIP AWARD (charm)

- Earn three Girl Scout Interest Project awards related to parts of the Girl Scout Law.
- Set goals and earn charms for the STUDIO 2B Focus book of your choice.
- Log 30 hours in a leadership role. (keep a log of hours)

# GIRL SCOUT GOLD CAREER AWARD (charm)

- Do a total of 40 hours related to career exploration.
- (keep a log of hours)
- Or, Fast Track it with a paying job or your own business.

# GIRL SCOUT GOLD 4Bs CHALLENGE AWARD (charm)

- Become: Assessment of skill set and setting and achieving two goals related to self-improvement.
- Belong: Create a community profile to find out more about the community needs and assets.
- Believe: Create a vision for change by focusing on community needs. Come up with an actual vision statement for one's Girl Scout Gold Award project based on challenge focusing.
- **Build:** Focus on developing a specific network of people who might help with the vision.

# Plan it:

Know more about it—research information on it.

Choose it—brainstorm ways to solve problem, create a budget. Council must approve any money-earning or gift-in-kind plans related to project.

Map it—create a timeline of project steps and list of resources needed. Fill out project plan for council.

Work with Girl Scout Gold Award project advisor.

- Submit Gold Award Proposal to your local GSGLA- Service Center for interview.
- Receive approval and complete project.
- Take 65 hours or more to complete project (including planning time & money earning)
- Submit Gold Award Final Report to your local GSGLA- Service Center by March 1<sup>st</sup>
- · Complete an exit interview
- Attend the GSGLA Gold Award Ceremony

# > Take the Gold Award Workshop

\*All prerequisites must be completed prior to taking this workshop. This workshop is mandatory.

#### The Project:

- Choose an issue: Use your values and skills to identify a community issue you care about. Explore your community.
- Investigate: Research everything you can about the issue.

# Choose your Girl Scout Gold Award Take Action Project.

- Create a plan: Create a project plan that achieves sustainable and measurable impact.
- Get help: Invite others to support and take action with you.
- Submit Gold Award Proposal to your local GSGLA- Service Center for interview. \*Applicant must complete interview and have project approved prior to beginning her project.
- Take action: Take the lead to carry out your plan.
- Educate and inspire: Share what you have experienced with others.
- Make a plan/Develop your project.
- Put your plan in motion.
- Spread the word
- Reflect & celebrate.
- Take approximately 80 hours to complete (including planning time & money earning)
- Submit Gold Award Final Report to your local GSGLA- Service Center by March 1<sup>st</sup>
  - · Complete an exit interview
  - Attend the GSGLA Gold Award Ceremony
