**OLD TESTAMENT** Isaiah 43:18–25

"Remember not the former things, nor consider the things of old. Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. The wild beasts will honor me, the jackals and the ostriches, for I give water in the wilderness, rivers in the desert, to give drink to my chosen people, the people whom I formed for myself that they might declare my praise.

**HOLY GOSPEL** Mark 2:1-12 *Jesus heals the paralytic*

When Jesus returned to Capernaum after some days, it was reported that he was at home. And many were gathered together, so that there was no more room, not even at the door. And he was preaching the word to them. And they came, bringing to him a paralytic carried by four men. And when they could not get near him because of the crowd, they removed the roof above him, and when they had made an opening, they let down the bed on which the paralytic lay. And when Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, "My son, your sins are forgiven." Now some of the scribes were sitting there, questioning in their hearts, "Why does this man speak like that? He is blaspheming! Who can forgive sins but God alone?" And immediately Jesus, perceiving in his spirit that they thus questioned within themselves, said to them, "Why do you question these things in your hearts? Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Rise, take up your bed and walk'? But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins"—he said to the paralytic—"I say to you, rise, pick up your bed, and go home." And he rose and immediately picked up his bed and went out before them all, so that they were all amazed and glorified God, saying, "We never saw anything like this!"



## 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Epiphany February 7, 2021

**Welcome to the Lord's House.** Epiphany means 'to make known, manifest, to show.' Epiphany season lasts until Ash Wednesday, Feb. 17. God watches over His followers and preserves them against all danger. His tender loving care for those who trust Him has been shown through many Biblical examples. Jesus, as the revelation of God's glory, demonstrated this same concern. The *Old Testament Lesson* promises a new relationship between God and His people. They have failed Him in many ways and insulted His holiness, yet He remains a forgiving God. In the *Epistle*, Paul points to Jesus Christ as the Seal of all God's promises. In the *Gospel*, we read of Jesus' dealings with a paralyzed man, forgiving his sins and restoring his health. He uses His power to heal as proof that He has authority to forgive. **The Lord bless this Divine Service.**



**We celebrate the Lord's Supper today**, in the confession, as Jesus says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread, wine but His very real, true body, blood to eat, drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him, and with one another. According to Scripture, Holy Communion is also a public confession of faith, sharing a unity in doctrinal belief; also those who eat, drink our Lord's body, blood unworthily or without discernment do so to their harm. In love towards God and our neighbor, according to Scripture, the Church has always practiced a closed communion. **Therefore, in love and pastoral concern for our guests, if you are not a member of the LCMS and desire to receive the Sacrament, please speak with the pastor first.**
