PONDERINGS FROM PASTOR CATHIE

To all God's beloved, who are called to be saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the

Lord Jesus Christ. We embark on a journey with summer in June, okofficially summer begins on June 20, yet our lives change as school is out, the weather is warmer, and we are drawn to spend as much time as possible. We may prefer sitting in a chair just enjoying listening to the birds and feeling the warmth of the sun, riding our bikes, running or walking outside. We seem to spend as much time as possible by or in the water, running through the sprinkler, at the pool, or at the beach.

Regardless of the type of activity we enjoy outside, one of the best parts of summertime is being in God's world. It is a gift to all of us to enjoy the colors,

textures, and aromas of the creation. Our lives are different in the summer than they are in the winter. The rhythm of the church activities change in the summer as well.

We are still in the season of Easter through May. On June 4, we will celebrate the Day of Pentecost and on June 11, it is Trinity Sunday. Then, we enter the season of "Ordinary Time" in the church year. This is the time between Pentecost and Advent. It is called "ordinary" because we move into a time of more regular elements of worship. The focus is more on the Lord's Day. We will have just completed a cycle of "extraordinary" time with the seasons of Advent and Christmas as well as Lent and Easter.

During ordinary time, we are provided the opportunity to read some of the books of the Bible that do not get as much attention during the "extraordinary" times. This summer, we are going to go on an adventure, as I prepare sermons for you, from six of the Old Testament books. We will start on June 18 with a "Book Sermon Series" on the book of Ruth. This will run through July 9. It is a fascinating story of God's love and kindness, and I am eager to bring the book of Ruth alive for us.

On July 16th, we will begin exploring five of the twelve Old Testament books during sermons, called the "Minor Prophets" or the "Book of the Twelve." There are twelve minor prophets: Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, and Malachi. This year, I will prepare "Book Sermons" on Hosea, Joel, Obadiah, Jonah, and Micah. These five minor prophets will take us up to Christ the King Sunday, on November 26. The Advent and Christmas season will begin on December 3.

I am excited about using these Old Testament texts for our sermons during this "Ordinary Time" season. There will be some challenges for all of us, as they are very different from the gospels that I have primarily preached on from the Advent/Christmas and Lent/Easter seasons this past year. Part of the anticipa-

tion is encountering the time before Jesus. The intent is that we will be able to identify and learn more about the world of our Jewish ancestors, and better understand the amazing gift God has given us in the Son, Jesus Christ.

During the week of May 15-19, I attended a continuing education event, the Fes-

tival of Homiletics. I am grateful for the call you extended to me which included continuing education. Thank you.

Our worship changes to its summer hours on Sunday, May 28, to a start time of 9:30 a.m. See you then!



July 23-28, 2016 Buena Vista University Storm Lake, Iowa

Herbert Nelson, right top, stated clerk of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), will be the convocation speaker, and Cláudio Carvalhaes, well-known speaker and worship leader, will lead evening worship.

Nelson, a noted speaker and preacher, and a strong force on issues of social justice, previously served as director of the PC(USA) Office of Public Witness in Washington, D.C.

Carvalhaes, a native of Brazil, joined the faculty of Union Theological Seminary in New York City last fall. He previously served on the faculty of Lutheran Theological Seminary in Philadelphia, Louisville (Ky.) Presbyterian Theological Seminary, and McCormick Theological Seminary in Chicago. Just a few years ago, Carvalhaes was the convocation speaker at Synod School.

More than 70 classes for adults will be offered, as well as a full program for children and youth, provide great opportunities for learning, renewal and fun.
