1987-88 FALL DART LEAGUE READY TO BEGIN

The 1987-88 Dayton Darting Association Fall League is scheduled to begin on Wednesday, September 9, and Thursday, September 10, according to league President Mike Coogan. Deadline for applications is August 27, 1987. Applications are available at sponsoring pubs and one is included in this newsletter.

The rules committee of Gene Cramer, Tom Patterson and Rick Davis has recommended a new ranking system that will be in effect this year. The league will be divided into three brackets, A, B, and C. The "A" bracket will consist of the GEM, GOLD, SILVER and BRONZE divisions. The "B" bracket includes the BLUE, RED, ORANGE, and GREEN divisions. The "C" bracket is made up of the YELLOW, WHITE, BROWN, and possibly GRAY, if there are enough teams. This rule change, as well as other changes will be explained at the Captains' Meeting on September 1.

Each division will be limited to eight teams and the league hopes to have 12 divisions. Four rounds will be played again this year, seven games to a round in each division. The first half playoff will be played at the end of the second round. The second half playoff will be held immediately after the end of the fourth round. First and second half winners will then meet for the Divisional Championship.

Each team may consist of no less than four and no more than six players. If you have not yet joined a team or if you would like to form one of your own, it's not too late. You can do so by calling 299-DART or filling out the enclosed application. Remember - the deadline for applications is August 27, 1987.

The mandatory Captains' Meeting will be on Tuesday, September 1, 1987 at $7:30\,\mathrm{pm}$ at the Rose E. Miller school on the corner of Devon and Marshall Roads in Kettering.





DART TIPS FROM NICK

Light, medium or heavy? After 15 years in this business, I still don't have a good definitive answer to this question. The ladies often think light darts are the way to go, but not necessarily so. I have found through teaching and throwing myself that heavy darts are much easier to throw. The correlation between the ping pong ball and the shot put is similar to darts. To throw a ping pong ball straight is very difficult due to its very light weight. The shot put, once in motion, easily goes in a straight line. This does not mean that heavy darts are the answer, but it seems to help in shot control.

No one has written a formula that equates height, weight or stature to the size dart you should throw. Often times players gravitate to the shape and weight used by the best players in the area. This isn't all bad, but it does not answer the light, medium or heavy question.

One alternative might be to buy three sets in various weight categories. With tungsten darts, the re-sale value is good, so you can sell the two you don't use. In our shop, the "try before you buy" method is still one of the better ways to pick the right weight.

Symptoms such as floating darts, excessive oscillation, or not being able to throw good groups might indicate a weight problem. I have discovered the grip is often the culprit and not the weight. An accomplished teacher can help to straighten out these problems.

In reality, there is no definitive answer to this age old question. Personal preference still seems to be the best method for selecting shape and weight to fit your particular style.


