Biography

Carl A. Palmateer, Sr., 92, of Cass City, died peacefully Saturday, April 20, 2024 in Hills and Dales Healthcare, Cass City. He was born February 2, 1932 in Deford to Harvey and Vina (Spencer) Palmateer. He married Joyce C. McInally on January 20, 1967 in Caro. Carl attended Cass City High School and enlisted in the United States Navy. He served aboard the U.S.S. Ticonderoga and also performed shore patrol in Pensacola, Florida during the Korean War era. Carl was honorably discharged from the Navy having earned the rank of Petty Officer Third Class. Returning home and having earned a pilot's license, he flew a fixed wing plane for the Tuscola County Sheriff's Department. Carl's job as a Tuscola County Sheriff's Deputy led him to become the Chief of Police for the Village of Cass City. He also owned his own truck and worked for many trucking companies, eventually retiring from Holland Motor Freight. Carl was always on the go, with a good sense of humor, and the "gift of gab".
