I thought this week that I would offer some options for you if you're interested in learning more about our Faith. Most of these involve the internet, so I understand they may not all be options for you if you don't have internet, but there are also some good books. If you need help with any of these, I'd be glad to be of assistance. This is not meant to be an exhaustive list.

Bible Studies:

- <u>Catholic Bible Study</u>: My Youtube Bible study that looks at the upcoming Sunday readings: three videos weekly, about 15 minutes each: youtube.com/@fatherbryankujawa
- The Bible in a Year w/ Fr. Mike Schmitz on Youtube (https://www.youtube.com/@TheBibleinaYear) or any podcast app that you use: daily episode, 20 minutes on average
- <u>Understanding the Scriptures</u> podcast (found on any podcast app): 30 episodes, over an hour each
- <u>Catholic Productions</u> (youtube.com/@catholicproductions) This guy, Brant Pitre, is awesome. He's got a variety of Bible study content. (There is some other paid content on their website, but this is all free and good.)
- St. Paul Center: run by Scott Hahn, a convert to Catholicism; really excellent. (stpaulcenter.com)

Catholic Podcasts:

- Abiding Together (found on podcast app or on Youtube) Sister Miriam James Heidland is awesome
- <u>Among the Lilies</u> (podcast) and/or Cameron Fradd (Youtube) she's married to another very popular podcaster/Youtuber, Matt Fradd (<u>Pints with Aguinas</u>)
- Catechism in a Year with Fr. Mike Schmitz: daily episode, averaging about 15 minutes each
- Catholic Answers Live: 10 episodes each week, about an hour each; people call in and ask real questions about the Catholic faith

Catholic YouTube Content:

- <u>Ascension Presents</u> (youtube.com/@ascensionpresents) They have a lot of good, short videos. They usually release 3 or so each week by different people who are all very good. The videos are typically around or less than 10 minutes.
- Counsel of Trent: Trent Horn is a Catholic apologist; he makes a living on defending and explaining the Catholic faith.

Homilies:

- <u>Gopher Catholic</u> (youtube.com/@gophercatholic5284) my good friend, Fr. Jake Anderson, is on the campus of the University of Minnesota in the Twin Cities. He preaches good homilies (uploaded on Tuesday mornings)
- <u>bulldogCatholic</u> (found on any podcast app) Fr. Mike Schmitz is on the campus of UMD in Duluth. He's one of the top two most famous priests in the country.
- <u>Bishop Robert Barron</u> (found on YouTube or podcast) He is the bishop of the Diocese of Winona-Rochester in southern Minnesota. He's the other of the two most famous priests in the country.

Books:

- Rome Sweet Home by Scott Hahn, a former Protestant pastor tells of his conversion to Catholicism
- The Case for Catholicism by Trent Horn; he confronts many Protestant objections to Catholicism
- Crossing the Tiber by Steve Ray, a former anti-Catholic Lutheran tells of his conversion to Catholicism
- Into Your Hands, Father by Wilfred Stinisson; great book about surrendering everything to the Father
- The Jewish Roots of the Eucharist by Brant Pitre; anything by Dr. Pitre is going to be rock-solid
- Introduction to the Devout Life by St. Francis De Sales; an all-time spiritual classic
- The Imitation of Christ by Thomas A Kempis; another all-time classic
- Stunned By Scripture: How the Bible Made Me Catholic by John Bergsma, another former Protestant
- <u>You and Me Forever: Marriage In Light of Eternity</u> by Francis and Lisa Chan, two Protestants, who give a good perspective on staying mission-focused while married

There are so many good books! Anything by a canonized Saint is going to be solid content. There are some excellent spiritual classics out there.

The Story of Our Lady of Sorrows

For a while there were two feasts in honor of the Sorrowful Mother: one going back to the 15th century, the other to the 17th century. For a while both were celebrated by the universal Church: one on the Friday before Palm Sunday, the other in September.

The principal biblical references to Mary's sorrows are in Luke 2:35 and John 19:26 -27. The Lucan passage is Simeon's prediction about a sword piercing Mary's soul; the Johannine passage relates Jesus' words from the cross to Mary and to the beloved disciple.

Many early Church writers interpret the sword as Mary's sorrows, especially as she saw Jesus die on the cross. Thus, the two passages are brought together as prediction and fulfillment.

Saint Ambrose in particular sees Mary as a sorrowful yet powerful figure at the cross. Mary stood fearlessly at the cross while others fled. Mary looked on her Son's wounds with pity, but saw in them the salvation of the world. As Jesus hung on the cross, Mary did not fear to be killed, but offered herself to her persecutors.

Reflection

John's account of Jesus' death is highly symbolic. When Jesus gives the beloved disciple to Mary, we are invited to appreciate Mary's role in the Church: She symbolizes the Church; the beloved disciple represents all believers. As Mary mothered Jesus, she is now mother to all his followers. Furthermore, as Jesus died, he handed over his Spirit. Mary and the Spirit cooperate in begetting new children of God—almost an echo of Luke's account of Jesus' conception. Christians can trust that they will continue to experience the caring presence of Mary and Jesus' Spirit throughout their lives and throughout history.

REFLECT

When we're sad or lonely, who better to turn to than our universal mother? Mary can feel the ripples of pain in our hearts and is ready to guide us to her son. Pray

Dear Mary,
Like a woeful child,
I am in need
of your motherly care.
Wrap your arms around me for comfort,
dry my tears,
take me by the hand,
and lead me to your Son,
the source of
all that is good.
For only he
can cast out the shadows
of my troubled heart.
Amen.
