

Arts. We in the Art Association have seen her work in our own shows, frequently winning Best in Show or placing First in her category.


Ellen began winning at an early age. She was a winner of a coveted gold key from the Gold Key Award competition which covers all high schools in the Southern California region. She went on to study art and graduate from UCLA, then continued her art education with classes at Otis Art Institute. She started her career in art as a recreation director, teaching to children, kindergarten through grade 12.

Since 1989, Ellen has appeared in solo and group exhibitions throughout the Southland too numerous to mention. Her work is shown in galleries in Palm Desert, Encino and Laguna Beach, and her paintings are in the

collections of many individuals and of major corporations such as IBM, Cinema Corp., ad the Jules Stein Eye Institute.

Agnes joined the Art Association upon moving to what was then Leisure World in 1975 - she's certainly

one of our longest term members! In 1990 she was judged into the Festival of the Arts where she remained a favored exhibitor for 17 years. In 2008 she joined the ranks of exhibitors across the street at the Art Affair where she remains today, exhibiting and selling the collages for which she is so well known.

Like many of us, Agnes came to art after retiring from a business career. In 1950, serving with the Foreign Service in Saudi Arabia, she began her studies with seminars from the Metropolitan Museum of Art because she needed something to do! Later she moved on

to art studies at Temple University, UC Irvine, and Saddleback College, incorporating oil, acrylics, watercolor

and mixed media into her learnings. Skilled in all these media, today Agnes chooses to focus on the whimsical and colorful collages for which she has gained her reputation as a foremost mixed media artist.

Today art is

the motivating factor in Agnes' life and weekend mornings you will find her in the Art Studio surrounded by fabrics, papers, photos and other objects from which she compiles her collage scenes of life. Her work starts with one vision but progresses in various directions as she proceeds, obviously filled with her fascination and

curiosity for the world around her, incorporating this emotional response into her work. A world traveled lady, Agnes also incorporates memories gained from her travels into her unique work.

She has also shown at various

West Coast art festivals: La Quinta, Sausalito, Beverly Hills, La Jolla, and Bellevue, Washington.

has visited into her paintings.



Carla Bosch




