- Plymouth SWCD has submitted a letter of opposition to the CDI bylaws change to be considered at Commissioner Annual Conference to be held August 23rd. They do not agree with the change to consider an SWCD (and all their commissioners) as 1 member, instead of the current status of 5 individual members. No action to be taken by Dubuque SWCD.
- NACD Grant #2 has been completed. Final report has been submitted and accepted.

<u>Guest Dubuque League of Women Voters</u> (LWV) – Sue Wilson & Tammy PinsI presented to board regarding what the LWV does and their desire to meet with local boards to see what each is involved in. Their intent is to recruit from their ranks members to attend local board meetings. If they can

assist the SWCD with any type of outreach we are encouraged to contact them. They also have a watershed game which may be of interest to us.

Watershed Project Report:

- Shirts has been received, caps are on order, signs are on hold as lowa Prison Industries is contracting with Wisconsin to do their printing and they haven't started back up due to COVID.
- City of Peosta recently passed a Stormwater Ordinance.
- Schmechel and Timm are discussing proposed minor changes in the Truterra program involving nitrate sampling for FY 22.
- Discussed paying to boost facebook pages.
- Field Day at Smith Farm. 20922 Asbury Road, 5-7 pm on August 25th. Iowa Corn Grower's Association is sponsoring and Cattlemen's Association is grilling. Flier is being developed.
- WI NRCS CIG Grant board agreed to support development of application by Sand Creek.
- SWCS annual conference and membership Timm and Wiley would like to attend at a cost of \$200 per non-member and \$150 per member. There also is a membership request.
- Loras College Videos to reach both urban/rural population. \$5,000 \$10,000 estimated cost to develop two videos. One shorter video and one 5-8 minute video on What Does Clean Water mean to you. Feature interviews with farmers, supervisors, city of Dubuque, local outdoor clubs, river museum, truterra, etc.
- JEO Consultants has been hired to work on the Northern Dubuque County Watersheds plan regarding the \$650,000 NRCS WFPO grant.
- CCWMA has about \$100,000 remaining to be obligated from original \$1.4 million. Have 2 projects in line for those funds.
- Request to purchase Infiltration Ring/Sweep Net & Penitrometer to be purchased added by board.

Personnel Updates:

FY 22 Health Insurance Rates for Watershed employees are \$53.31 per month for single plan and \$125.36 per month for a family plan SWCD cost is \$708.23 per single plan and \$1,665.50 per family plan.

Personnel Committee completed employee reviews. Watershed employees will receive a 3% raise effective August 1st. Schmechel will also maintain the \$500 reimbursement he currently receives monthly as additional salary after August 1st. Sweeney will receive a \$0.50 per hour raise effective August 1st.
