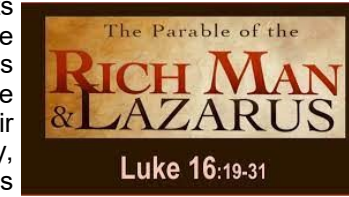

**Sunday's Theme**

Today's Gospel parable contrasts extreme wealth with absolute poverty. It is a familiar story wherein lies the poor Lazarus who is ignored at the rich man's gate, but after death, their status is reversed. In light of this story, we need to keep in mind that riches themselves are not bad; it's how they are used. Do we allow wealth to blind us to the needs of those right on our doorstep or those who need help from afar? May this Gospel touch our hearts, so that we who have more than enough of worldly riches may put them to good use in helping those in need of help.



**WORLD DAY OF MIGRANTS AND REFUGEES (September 25, 2022)**

On this day, the Church celebrates the 108<sup>th</sup> World Day of Migrants and Refugees. The theme chosen by Pope Francis this year is **"Building the Future with Migrants and Refugees"**. In the beginning of his message the Holy Father stated that "The ultimate meaning of our "journey" in this world is the search for our true homeland, the kingdom of God inaugurated by Jesus Christ, which will find its full realization when he comes in glory". Pope Francis further says, "No one must be excluded. God's plan is essentially inclusive and gives priority to those living on the existential peripheries. Among them are many migrants and refugees, displaced persons, and victims of trafficking. The Kingdom of God is to be built *with them*, for without them it would not be the Kingdom that God wants. The inclusion of those most vulnerable is the necessary condition for full citizenship in God's Kingdom". At the end of his message, Pope Francis says "Dear brothers and sisters, and, in a special way, young people! If we want to cooperate with our heavenly Father in building the future, let us do so together with our brothers and sisters who are migrants and refugees. Let us the build the future today! For the future begins today and it begins with each of us. We cannot leave to future generations the burden of responsibility for decisions that need to be made now, so that God's plan for the world may be realized and his Kingdom of justice, fraternity, and peace may come". Let us pray today for all migrants and refugees that they may journey towards a better future.

# CATECHESIS

## SEPTEMBER 25 - NATIONAL COLLECTION FOR THE NEEDS OF THE CHURCH IN CANADA

Each year the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops is asked to speak out, give leadership, or provide guidelines for the faithful on a wide variety of topics in our daily lives. In order for our Bishops to be able to make proper judgments on modern topics, they must have the benefit of research and expert advice. Both research and gathering information require staff, time, and money. Through the yearly *Bishops' Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada*, an appeal is made to all Catholics to be generous in supporting the work of their Bishops. Contributing to the collection is an action of collaboration with the Bishops in their ministry to teach, sanctify and govern. **Please give generously to the Needs of the Church in Canada.**

## SEPTEMBER 26 - FEAST OF SAINT JOHN DE BRÉBEUF AND SAINT ISAAC JOGUES, PRIESTS, AND COMPANIONS, MARTYRS, SECONDARY PATRONS OF CANADA:

This day honours the eight martyrs of North America who died between 1642 and 1649. All came from Europe as missionaries and all showed great courage in life and in facing death. Six of these missionaries were Jesuit priests and two were lay assistants. The six priests were Jean de Brébeuf, Isaac Jogues, Antoine Daniel, Gabriel Lalemant, Charles Garnier, and Noël Chabanel; the two lay assistants were René Goupil and Jean de la Lande.

**SEPTEMBER 27 - MEMORIAL OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL, PRIEST:** Vincent was born in France in 1580, ordained at age 20, and soon became involved in performing acts of charity. He organized groups to provide food and clothing for all who were poor: orphans, prostitutes, the sick, the disabled, the homeless. He established a congregation to preach and to train clergy, and he collected large sums of money for his many projects. His influence spread from France across Europe. Vincent is the founder of the Congregation of the Missions (Vincentians) and co-founder of the Daughters of Charity. He died in 1660 and was canonized in 1737. He is a patron saint of charitable societies.
