## Good morning!

Sometimes intentional fouls and flagrant fouls are ones we say 'We know it when we see it'. When the calling official knows it OR a partner has information to offer, we need to act on it.

Take a look at the clip <u>here</u> and decide your course of action....

Flagrant? YES, OF COURSE..... Supplemental? YES, FOR SURE....

These types of plays have NO PLACE in our game and need to be dealt with swiftly and promptly. Even though this was a scrimmage, the player needs ejected with a flagrant foul, the white player fouled shoots two free throws and white gets the ball nearest the spot of the foul.

A DQ form needs completed as soon as you get home from your game. It is under the 'Officials' tab then select 'Forms' and it is there and easy to complete! MAKE SURE to give the facts in the description, not opinions...for example, the one in the clip would be 'Jane Thrower attempted a three-point goal, we being boxed out and grabbed the arm of the defender and threw her to the ground.' When asked if this is a supplemental disqualification, that box SHOULD be checked because she 'physically confronted and opponent.' The entire description is in the preseason bulletin located at <u>Preseason Bulletin</u>.

Even in a scrimmage such as this one, a disqualification is warranted and needs submitted.

In addition, call our assignor to let him/her know what happened!

Monday Extra: Call your assignor for ANY abnormal events, including all technical fouls, that occur in your game. The assignor almost assuredly will hear about it from a coach or AD also! Getting the firsthand account helps a ton!
