# Eighth Sunday after Pentecost

# Go And Do Likewise!



In the Gospel this morning Jesus and a highly placed attorney within the religious circles of the day have a discussion. It appears the man wanted to ask Jesus what needed to be done to be saved. It is notable, of course, that this expert in the law could dance around all of the fine points of that same law. Perhaps Jesus knew he knew.....

So Jesus returns the conversation with a question, and the man responds with another

question. He felt the need to justify his position, which he thought to be quite certain, but in the light of what Jesus was saying, it was quite weak.

This is a case of Jesus taking the time to teach that actions speak louder than words. We have a tendency in our culture to identify with a person in the story, forgetting at the moment that the story has a plot and a purpose. The story actors are merely the guides to get us to the point of the story.

The point in this exchange between the lawyer and the Lord is not based upon the actors. It is, according to Jesus, based on the *actions!* The lawyers knew perfectly well what the words were. He was not engaging in the actions. And by not doing that, no matter what his personal though was, he completely misses Jesus' point in the story.

I suppose that it is important for us to remember that we have a stake in things as well. The lawyer shares the two points of the law: loving God with everything and loving our neighbor as ourselves. No amount of talking about this replaces the action steps necessary. Jesus affirms our role in loving God with our entire being. Jesus affirms our role in loving our neighbor as ourselves. And today, He invites us to go and engage in the actions matched to the words.

Do we enter the parable and share the actions of those who "walk around" their opportunities, or do we go and do likewise?

# FIRST LESSON- Deuteronomy 30:9-14

**New Living Translation (NLT)** 

"The Lord your God will then make you successful in everything you do. He will give you many children and numerous livestock, and he will cause your fields to produce abundant harvests, for the Lord will again delight in being good to you as he was to your ancestors. The Lord your God will delight in you if you obey his voice and keep the commands and decrees written in this Book of Instruction, and if you turn to the Lord your God with all your heart and soul.

"This command I am giving you today is not too difficult for you, and it is not beyond your reach. It is not kept in heaven, so distant that you must ask, 'Who will go up to heaven and bring it down so we can hear it and obey?' It is not kept beyond the sea, so far away that you must ask, 'Who will cross the sea to bring it to us so we can hear it and obey?' No, the message is very close at hand; it is on your lips and in your heart so that you can obey it.

### THE SECOND LESSON:Colossians 1:1-14 New Living Translation (NLT)

This letter is from Paul, chosen by the will of God to be an apostle of Christ Jesus, and from our brother Timothy. We are writing to God's holy people in the city of Colossae, who are faithful brothers and sisters in Christ. May God our Father give you grace and peace.

We always pray for you, and we give thanks to God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. For we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and your love for all of God's people, which come from your confident hope of what God has reserved for you in heaven. You have had this expectation ever since you first heard the truth of the Good News.

This same Good News that came to you is going out all over the world. It is bearing fruit everywhere by changing lives, just as it changed your lives from the day you first heard and understood the truth about God's wonderful grace.

You learned about the Good News from Epaphras, our beloved co-worker. He is Christ's faithful servant, and he is helping us on your behalf. He has told us about the love for others that the Holy Spirit has given you.

So we have not stopped praying for you since we first heard about you. We ask God to give you complete knowledge of his will and to give you spiritual wisdom and understanding. Then the way you live will always honor and please the Lord, and your lives will produce every kind of good fruit. All the while, you will grow as you learn to know God better and better.

We also pray that you will be strengthened with all his glorious power so you will have all the endurance and patience you need. May you be filled with joy, always thanking the Father. He has enabled you to share in the inheritance that belongs to his people, who live in the light. For he has rescued us from the kingdom of darkness and transferred us into the Kingdom of his dear Son, who purchased our freedom and forgave our sins.

THE HOLY GOSPEL: Luke 10:25-37 New Living Translation (NLT)

One day an expert in religious law stood up to test Jesus by asking him this question: "Teacher, what should I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus replied, "What does the law of Moses say? How do you read it?" The man answered, "'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, all your strength, and all your mind.' And, 'Love your neighbor as yourself."

"Right!" Jesus told him. "Do this and you will live!" The man wanted to justify his actions, so he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied with a story: "A Jewish man was traveling from Jerusalem down to Jericho, and he was attacked by bandits. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him up, and left him half dead beside the road.

"By chance a priest came along. But when he saw the man lying there, he crossed to the other side of the road and passed him by. A Temple assistant walked over and looked at him lying there, but he also passed by on the other side.

Then a despised Samaritan came along, and when he saw the man, he felt compassion for him. Going over to him, the Samaritan soothed his wounds with olive oil and wine and bandaged them. Then he put the man on his own donkey and took him to an inn, where he took care of him. The next day he handed the innkeeper two silver coins, telling him, 'Take care of this man. If his bill runs higher than this, I'll pay you the next time I'm here.'

"Now which of these three would you say was a neighbor to the man who was attacked by bandits?" Jesus asked. The man replied, "The one who showed him mercy." Then Jesus said, "Yes, now go and do the same."
