

WHAT TO EXPECT

How long does the service last?

Usually about an hour, possibly an hour and a quarter.

Where do I sit?

Anywhere you like. We do not reserve pews. You will not be taking anyone's seat.

What should I wear?

Some people wear "Sunday" clothes while others dress more casually. We're pretty laid back.

Will I be asked to stand up and introduce myself?

Absolutely not. We do ask that you either sign our guest book or the attendance book in the pew where you sit to let us know you were there, but neither is a requirement.

Do I have to pay any money?

No. There is an opportunity to give an offering, but it's totally up to you whether or not you drop in any money.

What about communion?

We have communion every week. It is dispensed by ushers (we call them deacons). You will be invited to eat the bread and drink the cup as the trays come to you. ALL are welcome to take communion as it is the Lord's table, and God welcomes everyone. We also have a gluten free option for those with allergies.

What about accessibility?

Sadly, our historic building is not ADA compliant, so persons in wheelchairs are unable to get to our restrooms or Fellowship hall. We do have hearing assistance if needed.

What about children?

We have a nursery with an adult attendant for infants and very young children. The greeter at the front of the building can help you find the Nursery room. We also have Children's Church for children 3 and older, which begins right after the Children's Moment near the beginning of our worship service.
