February 2, 2020 Feast of the presentation of the Lord Lk 2:22-40

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

"It's a-may--- Ay ---zing, With the blink of an eye, you finally see the light" that's how Steven Tyler of Aerosmith sings it. He's highlighting that moment of 'insight', when we discover something new. Or maybe when our vison broadens or clears, and we see all the same old things already out there but now, in an entirely new light! Notice that verse 33 says Mary and Joseph were 'amazed' at this Temple Baby Reveal! Simeon's retirement prayer song includes the words 'My eyes have seen your salvation' (Luke 2:30). Discoveries are exciting, like when we make a breakthrough discovery and shout 'Eureka'! Shouting 'Eureka' means more than just remembering where I left my keys; it means I have found a life-changing discovery that opens a new world. Who first shouted 'Eureka'? Long before the early American gold rush miners out west (by the way, Go San Fran 49's!), the first record of such a shout, was a Greek mathematician named Archimedes who yelled 'Eureka' as he eased down into a bathtub to get his mind off a problem that he had been assigned to solve. His King gave him the job of coming up with a way to determine whether a payment of gold he was given, was pure gold or diluted down with a lesser metal. So Archimedes hit upon the idea of buoyancy and water's displacement as a standard measure to weigh and compare pure gold versus a cheaper mix of metals. Can we say he 'plunged' into the idea of using water displacement as a test and measure? Apparently Archimedes jumped out of his bath, and ran straight back to his study with only a towel, so he could make notes of his discovery and begin his experiments. I bet the wild scene of him running down the street yelling about his new found discovery, was something for the townspeople of Syracuse to shout 'U-streaka'! But some other popular 'Eureka' moments are 'Newton's apple' and 'Einstein's chair'. But I point out that today we hear a biblical one from Simeon with this divine 'baby reveal'!

Simeon had been living under the personal prophecy given him by the holy Spirit that he would not die before seeing the Messiah come to the Temple as Micah 3:1 had predicted (Luke 2:26). When Mary and Joseph show up to present the 40 day old Jesus, Simeon's interior alarms start going off telling him that 'God is on the premises'. What a life fulfilling moment for Simeon, and a world changing moment for all of us, which highlights his actual declaration and retirement announcement! Simeon proclaims that Jesus is the expected Messiah, '1) a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and 2) glory for your people Israel' (Luke 2:32). Jesus Himself confirms this later when He says, 'I am the light of the world' (John 8:12). This double statement of both Simeon and Jesus, looks both forward and backward. It is forward looking because it proclaims that Jesus comes for the salvation of all people, yet also the statement registers a look back because it acknowledges that Jesus comes out from within the Jewish tradition and history. This, too, was all prophesied in the Old Covenant such as when Isaiah 2:3 announces that "1) Many peoples shall say: 'Come, let us go up to the 2) LORD's mountain,that he may instruct us in his ways' (identical quote in Micah 4:2). Jesus is born into a strongly Jewish heritage (the Lord's mountain). Yet His mission is to all the people of the earth (many peoples). Jesus originates among the people of the 'God of 'Abraham, Isaac and Jacob', yet now also fully revealed in glory as the salvation of all the world's people. That a distinctive Jewish Messiah would open religious salvation to everyone of the world, was clear from the old prophecies of Isaiah, such as when God said in 49:3, 'You are my servant, O Israel, and in you, I will show my glory {to all}." Also, in Isaiah 52:10, God's salvific work is revealed "in the sight of all the nations and all the ends of the earth can see the salvation of our God." Again, to go straight to Jesus, we hear Him say in John 17:4-5 "I glorified you Father, on earth by accomplishing the work that you gave me to do. Now glorify me, with you, with the glory that I had with you before the world began." God who created all things and all people, was born into the world within a specific family heritage (Jewish). But, God came through a particular people to redeem all He had made and include all people in the promise of final unity and restoration to come.

In case a question still lingers about whether Jesus came only for some, or that He came for all people, a great connection can be seen if we compare the retirement announcements of both St. Simeon, and St Paul. Simeon's retirement statement (Luke 2:32) comes in the beginning of Luke's gospel and Paul's comes at the end of Luke's second volume book, the Acts of Apostles (Acts 28:28). St Paul's final public statement in the last chapter of the Acts, echoes Simeon's opening statement outlining Jesus' universal mission of salvation to all the world. Paul says, "Let it be known to you that this salvation of God has been sent to the Gentiles" (Acts 28:28). Gentile refers to all people without Jewish heritage. It is a 'catch-all word' to include everyone else, not having a claim to Jewish family lines. 'Gentile' is a word that means 'everyone remaining' or 'everyone else not named already'. So, the 'Salvation of God sent to the Gentiles', means that the gospel of Jesus is proclaimed to everybody. We hear Jesus Himself command that the gospel be preached in His name, 'to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem' (Luke 24:47).
