

## **The Changes Continue**

Our lives continue to change in the midst of a global pandemic. The governor has told people of Ohio to stay home until April 6 with some exceptions. Please check out Bishop Thomas's reply to this latest request. Because of the governor's request and Bishop Thomas's reply I need to amend some more statements I have made in the past.

I will <u>not</u> have scheduled Confessions on Thursday or Saturday as I have previously stated. I hope to still have the Day of Grace on Wednesday April 8 of Holy Week to hear your confessions. I will start earlier than I originally planned so the new plan is to hear your confessions from 9 a.m. to Noon at Sacred Heart and then from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. at St. Joseph. The 1-hour retreat I had planned to have after Confessions has been cancelled.

Also, both Parish Offices will be closed until at least April 6. You can still call the offices and leave a message, but the doors will be locked. If you are able, please mail your church envelopes to the parish instead of dropping it off at the parish. I still plan on streaming the Sunday Mass to all of you because I see it as an "essential" way to help keep us connected.

I've heard many a minister state that "the number one rule of ministry is to go with the flow." As this pandemic continues our plans may need to change again. There are so many things to pray about regarding this pandemic. Here are a some of them: For strength, for an end to this pandemic, for medical staffs that have to work extra hard during this time, for those who are struggling financially, for those that have lost their jobs, for businesses that are struggling financially and may go bankrupt, for our teachers and school kids and the parents, for those suffering from missing Mass and the sacraments. Etc. Etc.

We are meant to be in community and now we need to be away from each other and avoid large groups. It is a conundrum! The life of a priest is to be with the flock of Christ and now I can't be with all of you as I would like. I can't visit nursing homes; I can only go to the hospital if someone is dying. I can't visit the homebound because they are the most vulnerable to the virus. I have a heavy heart because of this situation but rest assured that I am still praying for all of you.

Please continue to check out our parish websites so that we can stay in touch and you can be updated with the latest news. I will be making a lot of phone calls to stay in touch with you. Please remember the following Scripture quote in this trying time: "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me (Philippians 4: 13)."
