Deborah Sampson, the first woman to fight in and be honorably discharged from the American Military, captivates audiences in an immersive living history program chronicling her life. An indentured servant by age five, Deborah grew up in a man's world, where women were naught but second-class citizens. As a self-educated master-lass woman, she felt a higher calling, and in the final years of the American Revolution, Deborah bound her chest, tied back her hair, and enlisted in the 4th Massachusetts Regiment of the Continental Army. Learn about Deborah Sampson's remarkable story as History At Play's Founder and Artistic Director Judith Kalaora will portray her in this powerful presentation. Presentation will last approximately 45 minutes, followed by a Q & A.
