#### ATTENTION CASA DEL CIELO RESIDENTS

Casa del Cielo olive trees are scheduled to be sprayed on <u>Wednesday March 6<sup>th</sup>, 2019</u> weather permitting. They are sprayed with a growth inhibitor which will reduce or eliminate 80 to 90 percent of olive production.

Please make sure vehicles are not parked in front of, adjacent to, in driveways, or on the street next to an olive tree.

#### <u>Contractor will start spraying at</u> <u>7:00am</u> <u>on Wednesday March 6<sup>th</sup></u> <u>so please have vehicles moved early.</u>

Also let any contractors you may be using aware of this request.

**Do you have a flickering street light near your home?** First, you will want to see what numbers are on the light-pole. For numbers beginning with ID or SA: contact the Arizona Public Service at 602-371-5483 or you can go the APS website – <u>www.aps.com</u> – under the "Search" bar type in "**report flickering light**". Click on "**report outage**" and file your report.

For numbers beginning with SS: contact the City of Scottsdale at 480-312-5483. If the outage is related to a large green or beige transformer in the front side of yard area, contact the Arizona Public Service at 602-7171. In either case, it can take up to 20 business days for repair to be completed.

## Scottsdale shifts photo enforcement locations based on speed and crash data

Speeding and red-light cameras work in tandem to improve safety – a fact well-supported in Scottsdale and why the city will deactivate two locations and add four new intersection safety cameras next month. Photo enforcement systems on Thomas Road eastbound at Hayden Road and McDowell Road eastbound at Scottsdale Road will be deactivated.

Four new systems will be activated Friday, March 1: - Scottsdale Road southbound at Pinnacle Peak Road -Shea Boulevard westbound at 92nd Street - Frank Lloyd Wright westbound at Greenway-Hayden Loop -Indian School Road westbound at Hayden Road Choosing which locations no longer needed photo enforcement, and selecting new locations was a data-based decision made after city traffic engineers analyzed an aggregate of collision, red light/speeding violations, collision severity and traffic volume data.

## **BRUSH AND BULK COLLECTION – March 25, 2019**

#### A MESSAGE FROM THE CITY OF SCOTTSDALE:

Please separate your brush and bulk pickup into two piles – one for green waste and one for everything else.

The piles will be picked up by separate trucks during your designated brush and bulk pickup week.

The SRCA guidelines state the following:

+ Brush and bulk may not be set out more than 24 hours prior to the scheduled pick-up date.

+ Brush should not block the sidewalk or be placed in the street.

+ Brush pick includes all materials other than construction/remodeling debris, tires, and hazardous materials.
