This class is designed for children with little or no background in Spanish. Nicholas is a lovable character from the storybook *The Missing Cat*. The children will be learning Spanish in a very engaging way through Nicholas' adventures during his search for his missing cat.

The class focuses mostly on conversation. However, kids will be exposed to some written words and all kids in the class will also be provided with short and fun written exercises.

Pickup is on the blue benches outside the Upper Elementary/ Administration building.

The foreign language after-school clubs are taught by Tennessee Foreign Language Institute (TFLI - www.tfli.org). With small group sizes, children will receive plenty of individual attention from their highly trained instructor Julia Denison. Students will continue to learn to speak and understand Spanish through storytelling and reading, in real life contexts through the use of games, songs, role-playing, arts, food, video, etc. The teacher employs the Communicative Method, Total Physical Response, Story Telling and Drama, which promote the use of the "Target Language" from the very beginning levels in order to gently "immerse" students in the language in a natural and practical way. The goal of TFLI is to provide the students with the necessary skills to actually use and communicate in the language as soon as possible.
