



City of Spring Lake Park Boards and Commissions

Planning Commission

The Planning Commission consists of between five and seven members, serving staggered three year terms. The Planning Commission advises the City Council on land use actions for the City Council. The Planning Commission is charged with preparing and recommending a Comprehensive Plan. The Planning Commission also holds public hearings and making recommendations on land use actions such as amendments to the official zoning map, zoning ordinance text amendments, subdivision applications, conditional use permits and variance applications.

The Planning Commission generally meets on the 4th Monday of each month (except December) at 7:00pm at Spring Lake Park City Hall.

Parks and Recreation Commission

The Parks and Recreation Commission serves in an advisory capacity to the City Council and the Parks and Recreation Director. The Parks and Recreation Commission reviews the condition and adequacy of park property, considers names for city park property, proposes regulations for control of city park property, advises on the preparation of specific park plans, and makes recommendations on park improvements and recreation program enhancements.

In addition to the above duties, members also help the Recreation Department with large group/family events such as the Turkey Shoot, Santa Breakfast and Parent/Child Mini Golf Tournament. The Commission also runs the concession stands at the youth softball tournaments in July. The money raised from these events is put into a special fund used for park development, as recommended by the Commission.

The Parks and Recreation Commission generally meets on the 1st Tuesday of each month at 6:00pm at Spring Lake Park City Hall
