


There will be no meeting on Tuesday, October 18th. The next meeting is Tuesday October 25th from 7-8:30pm in the social hall.



## The Word of God Alive:

## Discussing the Readings w/your children

Here at our parish, we are transitioning away from Children's Liturgy of the Word during the Mass, and instead, we would like to encourage parents to discuss the weekly readings or homily with their children either before or after Mass occurs. This spiritual conversation, even if it is simple or a bit scattered, can be very powerful, and it is a way for God's word to come alive in our hearts. We will provide questions and discussion points to help parents start this conversation with their children, and please consider doing this with your family each week!

Today's gospel is a parable, a story with more than one meaning. This is a parable about a widow whose husband died. She needed a judge to get justice from someone who had harmed her. She was likely alone because a woman at that time would not go to the court without her husband or son. The judge was not interested in giving her justice for it's own sake.

### What did the woman keep doing?

The judge decided to give her a judgement just so she would stop bothering him.

Even though the judge did not care about the woman, did he do the right thing?



One type of prayer is to ask God for what we want. We know God is not selfish like the judge, but loves us fully. Because God is so good, he wants to answer our prayers. Jesus tells us to pray always.

Sometimes it seems that God is not answering our prayers. That may be because what we are asking for might be "not now" for God.


