#### TAX DAY

Tuesday April 17<sup>th</sup> is the last day to file Federal and State tax returns (or file for an extension). Note that California grants an automatic 6-month extension of time to file a state income tax return (through October 15, 2018). You don't have to apply for the extension, and no form is required. If you owe taxes, you must still pay the amount due by April 17 or you will begin to accrue penalties and interest.

## **AGE CERTIFICATION FORM**

The March newsletter included the Chantarelle Age Certification Form. If you have not already done so, please complete the form and send it to Strong Property Management, PO Box 1368, Sonoma, 95476.

It is a requirement of CC&Rs (para. 8.2) that age certification be done at least every two years and it was last done in 2016.

#### **BREAD PUDDING RECIPE**

Carol Colglazier's delicious contribution to our St. Patrick's Day party drew many requests for the recipe, so here it is:
Lucky Bread pudding with Irish Whiskey Sauce (serves 8):
Use a 9x15 metal pan 6 cups stale bread torn into small pieces 4 cups milk 3 eggs 1-½ cups sugar

1-½ cups sugar
3 tablespoons vanilla extract
I cup raisins or other dried fruit
8 ounces unsalted butter
2 cups confectioners' sugar
½ cup whiskey

1 teaspoon vanilla extract 2 egg yolks, lightly beaten In a large mixing bowl, combine the bread and milk. Let stand until the milk is absorbed.

In a mixing bowl, combine the 3 eggs, sugar, and 3 tablespoons vanilla extract and mix together until the sugar is dissolved. Stir in the raisins. Stir the eggs and sugar mixture into the bread. Pour the bread mixture into a shallow baking dish and bake in a preheated 350 degree oven until browned and the pudding is set, approximately 40 minutes. To make the sauce, melt the butter in a small saucepan over low heat.

Stir in the confectioners' sugar: continue stirring until the sugar is dissolved. Add the whiskey, 1 teaspoon vanilla and the egg yolks, whisking constantly. Continue to cook, whisking, until the sauce thickens slightly, approximately 5 minutes. Let the sauce cool to room temperature. To serve, pour half the sauce over the bread and heat under the broiler until the sauce is bubbling. Remove from the oven and spoon the remaining sauce over individual servings. Serve warm. Enjoy!
