Gaming News

Reno. Station Casinos has announced that it will build a \$50-\$70 million casino in Reno, it's first in Northern Nevada. The project will be located on Virginia St. near the convention center and will not include a hotel. No name or development timetable were disclosed.

Atlantic City. The Showboat has reopened as an 852-room nongaming boutique hotel. Revel, which was supposed to reopen before Showboat, still has not.

California. As expected, Larry Flynt has bought the Normandie Casino card club in Gardena. Terms of the sale weren't disclosed, but it was announced that the name will be changed to Larry Flynt's Lucky Lady Casino. Flynt also owns the nearby Hustler Casino.

Native American. The National Indian Gaming Commission reports that tribal casinos generated a record \$29.9 billion gambling win in 2015, a 5% jump over 2014 and the largest increase in a decade. The win came from 474 casinos operated by 283 tribes.

Macau. Las Vegas Sands Corp. \$2.9 billion resort, The Parisian, opened in September. Adding the 3,000-room resort will give Sands 13,000 rooms over four interconnected resorts on Macau's Cotai Strip.

Online. Daily fantasy sports seems to be making some headway, with seven states—Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, Mississippi, Tennessee, Indiana, and Virginia—having enacted laws specifically legalizing the activity. The bigger fish, e.g., New York and California, have legislation pending.



Play It Again

A woman who bought a losing lotto ticket in Pine Bluff, Arkansas, has become that state's latest lottery millionaire after winning the 'Play It Again" drawing. Stacy Tackett entered her non-winning lottery ticket in the drawing, which "allows players a second chance to win by entering non-winning tickets in a drawing to win a prize." Tackett won \$1 million during the drawing, and says she is going to buy a new truck and set up trusts for her children with her winnings.

Saints Scratch-Off

As the New Orleans Saints enter their 50th season, the Louisiana Lottery joined in the celebration by launching \$5 Saints Gold—a Saints-branded scratch-off game. Saints Gold features three anniversary-themed scenes emblazoned in gold metallic ink. Players have the chance to win cash prizes, including one of four top prizes of \$100,000, plus the opportunity to enter non-winning tickets into a series of secondchance drawings to win unique game-day prize experiences or official autographed Saints merchandise. The four secondchance drawings will involve a total of 34 winners and the type of experience to be given away depends upon the entry period.

A Lucky Survivor

As if surviving a crash-landing on an airliner wasn't lucky enough, a Dubai-based Indian man is celebrating a \$1 million lottery win just days after the terrifying ordeal. Mohammad Basheer Abdul Khadar, 62, was on board Emirates flight EK521 en route from southern India when it skidded on the runway as it landed in Dubai and burst into flames. Thirteen passengers were injured and a firefighter was killed responding to the emergency. Days later, Khadar's winning number in the Dubai Duty Free Millennium Millionaire draw was pulled at Dubai International Airport, netting him Dh3.67 million (US\$1 million). Khadar, who works at a car dealership in Dubai, told Gulf News he purchased the ticket a month earlier as he set off on vacation with his family in the south Indian state of Kerala. "I am blessed to have won," Khadar said. "I want to help the children who are less fortunate than others and need some financial help and medical support."

Bingo Raves

An entrepreneur from Northern Ireland who co-founded the Bingo rave phenomenon "Bongo Bingo" that's sweeping the United Kingdom is set to take the event worldwide. Bingo raves are Bingo gaming parties that include nightclub-style music and dancing and have become popular with younger audiences. Jonny Lacey, 30, from Belfast, has been flooded with offers to host the popular parties in venues from Australia to Mexico-and now plans to bring his famous Bingo nights to his home city. Bongo's Bingo has changed the face of the popular pastime: Players can win prizes including convertibles, holidays to the Caribbean and speed boats. And it all happens while dancing to '90s pop music while Lacey calls out the next Bingo number. The event was launched in Liverpool by Lacey and business partner Josh Burke. The shows quickly became a sell-out and the pair invested in bigger prizes and venues, and invited celebrity guests including David Hasselhoff and the Vengaboys to host.

A Bingo Attacker

An armed security guard working at Buckeye Bingo in Waco, Texas, fought off a would-be attacker, then shot and killed him in the parking lot of the business, the Waco police reported. The security officer was reportedly shot in the hand during the altercation

Minnesota Has a New Millionaire!

Chanhassen resident Juli Smith won \$1,591,402 playing Wild Cherry slots at Mystic Lake Casino Hotel in Prior Lake in September. This is one of the biggest jackpots in Mystic Lake's history.

"Winning a jackpot of this magnitude is rare," said Tom Polusny, general manager of Mystic Lake. "We are preparing to celebrate our 25th anniversary next year. Looking back, this is our third largest jackpot in Mystic with a masked man. The man reportedly approached the guard from behind and tried to put his arm around him while reaching for the security guard's gun. During the alleged struggle for the handgun, the security guard was able to discharge his firearm, and the suspect was injured. According to police, the wouldbe attacker attempted to run into a nearby alley but fell and later died at the scene. Emergency responders transported the guard to an area hospital for treatment of his injuries. About 150 people remained in the Bingo hall throughout the incident. The hall reopened a short time later. No one in the hall was injured.

While Stephen Colbert was broadcasting from the Republican National Convention, he added a game for viewers at home to play along with during coverage. The Late Show Twitter account posted a link to Republican National Convention Bingo which featured a Bingo card with squares that referenced something that you could possibly see happen during the convention. The very happy winner, who was at Mystic Lake enjoying a celebratory evening with her friends and husband of 16 years, could hardly believe her luck. "I'm numb. It's like this isn't real. Will you pinch me?" When asked what she's going to do with the money, Smith responded, "College for my son. That's all I care about."



VA Spends Big for Artwork

Veterans

Consider this: \$1.2 million for a sculpture. That's how much the Department of Veterans Affairs has paid to put a chunk of rock in the courtyard of the Palo Alto Mental Health Center.

In the name of disclosure, it was actually \$482,960 for the rock itself and \$807,310 for groundwork around it. Granted, the rock was cut into squares and fitted back together, but still...The tally for artwork spending at Palo Alto tops \$6 million at this point.

OpenTheBooks.com has investigated and determined how much the VA is spending on artwork.

Example: Quotations by Eleanor Roosevelt and Abe Lincoln, in Morse code, attached government contracts. One contract for artwork (\$55,000) was categorized as Miscellaneous Furniture and Fixtures.

It appears that one Florida

company has raked in over \$11

million over the years in various

Then there's the company in New Jersey with a \$3.75 million VA contract to provide a wide variety of items, including still cameras, fittings for ropes and cables...and fur materials.

According to the OpenTheBooks.com website, the artwork numbers are crawling up each year. A mere \$34,000 was spent in 2004. By 2010 it was up to \$1.7 million. In 2014 the expenditures had shot up to \$3.1 million. In 10 years, the tally comes to nearly \$20 million for artwork.

Bingo Shill?

Dear Aunt Bingo,

I picked up an issue of the Nevada edition of the Bingo Bugle. I found that on page 30 there was posted a picture of a lady who was the winner of \$3,750 at a casino power Bingo event. Then, on page 33 there is posted a picture of the same lady but with a different name and described as the winner of \$500 for the early bird at the same casino.

What happened? Is she one of the people that the casinos hire for the big money winner? I heard that the casinos hire people to come in and play and they win the big money, and that money goes back to the casino cage, and the person hired gets a percentage of the win. **—S.J., Henderson, Nevada, via email**

Dear S.J.,

I contacted a staff member of the Bingo Bugle's Nevada Edition and checked out what you discovered in the paper. What I learned, however, is not nearly as sinister as what you proposed.

First off, it is certainly not unusual for a person to win more than one jackpot during a Bingo session. Granted, this would not result in them changing their name, but it could result in two photos being taken. If the wrong caption ended up on one of the photos, it may be due to the photographer making a notation error after photographing the winner a second time.

Setting that theory aside, it is far more likely that the duplicate photo was simply a design error.

When designers are laying out the pages of the paper, some may use premade templates to make the job easier. Sometimes they may use a new template; other times they may open an old template and "reuse" the text boxes and photo boxes, stripping out the old pictures, stories and captions and adding new ones. As a result, the same picture might accidentally not be removed, resulting in its appearing more than once. Alternatively, a new image may be inserted twice on different pages in the course of page design without anyone noticing.

However the error occurred, the Nevada Edition certainly regrets the mistake.

Interestingly, a number of years ago the same edition had

an error in which a photo caption described a young male player enjoying his first time at Bingo, while the photo depicted a man in his 50s or 60s. That error made it all the way to The Tonight Show with Jay Leno, where it was featured in one of Leno's segments on funny news stories.

Finally, in response to your assertion that casinos hire people to win jackpots and return them to the casinos...

It seems a bit of a stretch to believe a casino would risk losing its license, face criminal charges, or be shut down for attempting to "steal" Bingo jackpots of a few hundred or even several thousand dollars. And when the really big jackpots happen, casinos go out of their way to publicize the event, showcase the winner and entice more players to visit. Would they really publicize a shill?

While preparing this column, I also Googled news stories about Bingo scams/shills at casinos and found virtually nothing—except for a story from the 1980s on a raid of an Indian Bingo for using planted players. That said, I of course welcome input from any casino Bingo pros out there who know otherwise. **—Aunt Bingo**

Nursing Home Care

Dear Savvy Senior,

Can you give me some tips on finding a good nursing home for my 86-year-old mother? She had a stroke a few months ago and has been receiving care at home but it's become too much. — *Leery of Nursing Homes*

Dear Leery,

Finding a well-run nursing home that provides quality care is an important decision that requires some homework. Here's what you should know.

Finding Good Care

The decision to move a loved one into a nursing home can be a difficult one. In most cases, the decision is forced by a sudden decline in health or mental ability, or by a gradual realization that they can no longer receive the care they need at home. Whatever the circumstance, here are some steps that can help you find a good nursing home and avoid a bad one:

• **Make a list:** Contact your Area Agency on Aging for a list of local nursing home facilities. Ideally, the facilities should be close to family members and friends who can visit often. Residents with frequent visitors usually get better care. The national Eldercare Locator (800-677-1116, or <u>www.eldercare.gov</u>) can direct you to your local aging agency.

• Online help: The Internet is a great resource to help you find and research nursing homes. Medicare offers a Nursing Home Compare resource at www. medicare.gov/nhcompare/home. asp that lists every nursing home that accepts Medicare and Medicaid by state, city, and Zip code. Also see the Consumer **Reports Nursing Home Quality** Monitor at <u>www.consumerreports.</u> org/nursinghomes. This free resource identifies nursing homes that are likely to provide betterquality care and those you need to avoid. You can also purchase detailed nursing home reports through companies like www. healthgrades.com and www. carescout.com.

• Ombudsman help: This is a government official who investigates nursing home complaints and advocates for residents and their families. Be sure you call them. They can tell you about the nursing homes in your area as well as which ones have had complaints or other problems. To find your local ombudsman, call your area aging agency or see <u>www.</u> <u>ltcombudsman.org</u>.

• **Check the ownership:** According to a recent study by Consumer Reports, independent not-for-profit homes generally provide better care than for profits owned by chains. Call the nursing homes you're interested in and ask if they have recently, or are about to change owners. One that's for sale might have problems, just as one with a new owner might be getting better.

• Facility visits: Once you've narrowed your search, visit each facility so you can evaluate them first-hand. Be sure to find out if they're capable of providing the kind of care your loved one needs, what they charge, and if they accept Medicaid. While you're there, talk with the staff, residents and their family members, if available. Taste the food, check the cleanliness of the facility, and notice if the staff is responsive and kind to its residents. Ask the nurses aides how many residents they each care for (the smaller the number, the better). It's also a smart idea to include an unannounced visit in the evening or on the weekend when staffing problems are most prominent.

• **Staff turnover:** Ask the nursing home administrator about top level turnover. If the administrator and the director of nursing have worked at a facility for several years, that's usually a positive sign. Frequent changes in those positions indicate instability, which could translate into poor care.

• **Inspect the inspection:** Read the nursing home's state inspection survey, known as Fonn 2567. It should be readily accessible. If it's not and you have difficulty obtaining it, consider that a warning that the facility may be hiding problems or violations. • **Compare facilities:** Medicare has a checklist at <u>www.medicare.</u> <u>gov/nursing/checklist.asp</u> that can help you evaluate and compare the nursing homes you're considering.

Savvy Tip: If you find yourself in a situation where your elder loved one has been hospitalized because of a medical condition or injury, and the hospital wants to discharge them before you've had time to investigate any nursing homes, you can appeal to Medicare to extend the hospital stay for two days. That will buy you some time to locate a good facility.

What's New in Nevada

Palms Sold

The Palms has been sold to Station Casinos. Other than the general announcement, which included the sale price of \$312.5 million, very little additional information has been released. However, it's expected that the name will remain unchanged given the strong brand recognition of the Palms. The deal is expected to close later this year.

Plans are Pending

Sands Stadium





Prepare the veggies of your choice as directed. Place a grill pan over medium-high heat or prepare the barbecue (medium-high heat).

butter is melted and the glaze is smooth, about 2 minutes, stirring often. Remove from the heat.

After the veggies have all been grilled, place them in an appropriate-sized foil pan. Brush them with the glaze. Poker Talk



the Blinds

by Steve Rosenbloom

One of the trickiest parts of nolimit hold 'em involves a battle of the blinds. Among other things. you often have a marginal hand that requires the ability to identify when you hold a thin edge.

"If I'm in the small blind," championship pro Eli Elezra said, "I'll always try to see the flop, even when I don't have position. I don't care if I have deuce-7. I won't raise, and I'll immediately check to see how fast he might check behind me.

"Some tricky professional players will check behind me quickly with good hands, but when I see a weak player do it really fast, I know he has nothing. If a small card hits, I'll definitely bet into him and try to take it.

"If I'm in the big blind, I'll see how many times he checks into me and I'll try to play the player, no matter what I have in my hand."

You might be sitting next to that player for hours, so it's especially important to learn all you can about his style, such as Elezra did in this hand from the World Series of Poker \$10,000-buy-in main event at the Rio Hotel in 2010.

With blinds at \$200-\$400 plus a \$50 ante, the small blind called, and Elezra checked his option with Q-4 offsuit in the big blind.

The flop came A-10-3, two diamonds. The small blind checked, potentially allowing Elezra to bet in position.

"I checked because I couldn't face a check-raise," said Elezra, a top cash-game player who has won WSOP and World Poker Tour titles.

The turn came the queen of clubs, giving Elezra top pair. The small blind checked again. Elezra bet \$1,000.

"There was about \$1,700 in the middle, and now I wanted to know where I was and where this guy was," Elezra said. "The guy hadn't played a hand yet at the table. He called me right away. I know he has some kind of hand, either a pair or a draw. Maybe he has two diamonds. Maybe he has a weak ace and he's scared to bet."

The river came the 2 of hearts. The small blind checked again.

"I checked immediately behind him," Elezra said. "I had a queen with a bad kicker. He could easily have a queen with a better kicker. He could easily have aces there. I didn't know how he played."

Elezra took the pot when the small blind showed 10-8 offsuit.

"He had third pair, but he had second pair on the flop," Elezra said. "That's why he called quickly on the turn. He had something and he thought I was bluffing.

"I didn't know the guy. I needed to see what the guy limped with to tell me something about him. Now when I see the way he played that hand and the way he thought I was bluffing, I could easily have bet the river and gotten paid off another \$1,000."

Tossing a Dealt Winning Hand

Most of the time when you are dealt a winning hand when you play video poker, you should hold all the cards and happily watch your credit meter increase by the amount of the payoff. But always holding a dealt winning hand isn't necessarily the right play to make in all cases. Take for example the following hand (assume you are playing Jacks or Better).

Jh-Qh-Ah-6h-10h

Well congratulations, you were just dealt a paying flush in hearts. For a five-coin wager, the payback is 30 coins on a 9/6 Jacks or Better machine (or 25 coins if you happen to be playing a short-pay 9/5 or 8/5 game). But wait a minute! If you take another look at this hand, you'll notice it also contains four cards to the royal flush (10-J-Q-A of hearts). It's tempting to take that certain 30-coin profit right then and there rather than take the risk of going for the royal flush and possibly ending up with a zero payoff. (As the saying goes, "a bird in the hand is worth two in the bush." Really?)

If you hold a four-card royal flush, here are the possible results when you draw one card.

You could draw another heart, which will give you a paying flush. There are 13 hearts per deck. You hold five of them in your hand; therefore, there are 7 hearts left in the remaining 47 undealt cards that would give you a paying flush. (This excludes the K of hearts, the card you need for the royal flush. The seven cards that would give you a flush are the 2-3-4-5-7-8-9 of hearts). If you drew one of those seven cards, you'd get paid 30 coins.

Another possibility is you could get a straight when you draw to the four-card royal flush. In the above hand, if you drew a king in spades, clubs, or diamonds you would end up with a straight that pays 20 coins.

A third possibility is to draw another jack, queen, or ace that would give you a high pair for a five-coin payout. There are four of each of those cards in a deck. You hold three of them in your hand. Therefore, there are nine of these high cards left in the remaining 47 cards that will give you a high pair and a 20 coin pay out.

The last possible result is the one you are praying for; namely, drawing the king of diamonds, which will give you a royal flush and a big 4,000 coin pay out. (There is only 1 king of diamond in the 47 remaining cards; therefore, the odds of this happening are 1/47.)

There are no other possible winning hands when you hold a J-Q-A-10 in hearts and draw one card (e.g., you can't get two pair, or four-of-a-kind or even a straight flush).

I've tabulated the possible results of drawing one card to the Jh-Qh-Ah-10h in the table below. The first column shows the possible winning results, the second column summarizes the number of times you could get each result, the next column shows the probability of getting each result, and the fourth column is the product of the probability times the payoff. If you sum the last column, you arrive at an expected value (or EV) of 92 coins. The latter is the average payback you can expect when drawing one card to a four-card royal flush, after an infinite number of trials.

Putting this into perspective, let's assume you are a dollar player playing \$5 per hand (max coins). If you decided to hold the paying flush, your return will be a certain \$30. If instead, you decide to hold the four-card royal flush, your average payback will be about \$92. Yes, some of the times you will win nothing when you draw one card and don't get a royal flush, flush, straight, or high pair (that will happen 27 times out of 47); other times, you'll get a flush and win \$30 (probability 7/47), or get a \$20 payoff for a straight (3/47), a \$5 payout for a high pair (9/47), and, if you are lucky, a whopping \$4,000 payout for a royal flush (1/47).

When you average all the possible payouts for this hand times the probability that each winning hand will occur, your average payback will be \$92, which is slightly more than three times the certain \$30 payback for holding the paying flush. Unless you plan to play one video poker hand in your lifetime, a \$92 average payback in the long run (by tossing the winning flush) is a whole lot better than a certain \$30 payback (by holding the flush).


