Valley Springs News





CALAVERAS ADULT TUTORING (CAT) by Phil Guttierrez

The Calaveras Adult Tutoring has completed a highly successful Fiscal Year 16-17. Phil Guttierrez, Literacy Coordinator, began his tenure with the Calaveras Adult Tutoring (CAT) in May 2016. Phil Guttierrez comes to Calaveras County after 24 years of distinguished federal government service, with the Federal Bureau of Prisons (FBOP). Phil, a certified teacher, began his career with the prison system as a Spanish Literacy Instructor. Most notably, he worked exclusively with the Muriel Cuban inmates at the Federal Correctional Institution in Tucson. After a highly successful career with the FBOP, Phil retired as a Warden at the Federal Correctional Complex in Victorville California. He and his wife relocated to Northern California to be near their children and grandchildren. Phil has had extensive experience in correctional and adult community education.

Adapting to the Calaveras Adult Tutoring (CAT) has been a challenge. Phil often compares the CAT budget with shopping at Walmart but paying the bill at Costco. Fund raising has been a key to the success of the CAT program. Grants from the California Library Literacy Service, charge-back services for instructional services provided by CAT to county entities (the Sheriffs Department, the **Probation Department** and newly re-established Department of Social Services or CalWorks), donation through tax inserts, and financial assistance from the Friends of the Library have

been critical in sustaining CAT. The computerized network instructional format is currently available at the County Jail, Day Reporting Center (Probation), CalWorks (Health and Human Services), and at the San Andreas Central Library. In addition, individualized tutor sessions are held at various branch library sites. The computerized networking instructional system is comprised of four active programs, the GED Academy, TABE or Test of Adult Basic Education (new program), Computer Essentials, and Work Essentials (new program). The four programs provide the learner in Calaveras County with effective preparation for the General Education Development (GED) test assisting the low skilled reader with tools and learning methodology to improve their reading capacity (TABE), computer skills development with the Computer Essentials, and job skills development with the Work Essentials Program.

CAT is extremely fortunate to have a dedicated pool of tutors to provide unselfish and structured services to

the participating learner. A big shout out to some of the active tutors.

(Jail), David Johnson (Central and individual Algebra tutoring), Patricia Gillin-Fur (DRC and individual nonreader tutoring), Josie Washington (Central), Marie Schafle (CalWorks and individual tutoring), Nancy Stehura (individual Algebra tutoring), Rebecca Turner (individual tutoring), George Paul (Jail), and others tutors who continue to volunteer their time to assist the learners of Calaveras County. In addition, Ann Seeley, part-time employee, has provided invaluable contributions as a tutor (Jail) and a trouble shooting Essentials computer network guru and administrative support.

The FY 2016-17 preliminary data (FY ends on June 30, 2017), list of accomplishments include the following: 85 learners serviced, 2,285 instructional hours provided, with a tutorial pool of 20. CAT has thirteen active tutors providing in excess of 500 hours of tutorial instructional hours. Examples of learning activities include a college student from Angels Camp, who was struggling with her college Algebra class. She was tutored by a tutor with a Chemical Engineer background, and resulted in her passing the Algebra class, with an A grade, and completing the requirements for her Associate of Arts!

ADULT LITERACY PROGRAM OF CALAVERAS COUNTY

The Adult Literacy Program of Calaveras County is part of a statewide program. With your support, Calaveras Friends of the Library has been an advocate and financial contributor to Calaveras Adult Tutoring - the only adult literacy program in Calaveras County.

Services are confidential and free of charge. These services are goal-oriented and individually tailored to personal needs; they also recognize and actively support the role a parent may play as a child's most important teacher. The program is designed to improve overall wellbeing through life-enriching topics:

- EDUCATION Improve reading, writing, spelling, and math with personal tutoring. You can also get help with studying for a GED.
- EMPLOYMENT Learn job search skills, including building a resume and writing cover letters, interviewing skills, and computer basics.
- FINANCIAL AWARENESS Learn about personal banking, budgeting, managing credit, and saving or investing your money.
- NUTRITION Explore how eating habits affect our lives, and how they can support a healthy mind & body.

- FITNESS Discover current fitness information and where to find fitness programs for all ages.
- HEALTHCARE Get help with reading and understanding medical terms and labels on medicines and supplements.

Since 1998, hundreds of adults have enrolled in Calaveras Adult Tutoring to improve their literacy skills. For more information, or to meet with a personal tutor, call the Literacy Program for Calaveras County at 209-754-6006.

The Secret Garden had a great turnout for Friends of the Library of San Andreas/Mtn. Ranch Library Branch.


