

Pastor's Study **Desk Notes**



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

25th Sunday Ordinary Year B Mk 9:30-37

"Whatcha talking about—Let me in on it?" Maybe you walked into a room that went dead silent right as you entered it, or you noticed a lot of animated gestures through the car windows right before you got into the back seat of a rideshare carpool. I suspect Jesus feels that way in the gospel today, leading Him to ask the disciples what they were so energetically arguing over, while they walked along behind Him. Of course, they go 'mute' on Him, because of shame at their silly argument over which one of them was the most powerful (He knew they had nonsensically been arguing who was 'King of the Hill'). Many a time when I was growing up as a kid, we brothers might be whispering things or telling jokes, and then mom would walk up and ask what was going on. We would clam up not knowing what we should say. Of course, she would say back, "If you can't tell me, then you shouldn't be talking about it in the first place!"

What surprises me most about this episode of the apostles arguing over who is 'top dog' is that Jesus had only two seconds before this, given them some more teaching on how he would lead and save His people. He taught them that He would 'suffer and die for them'. Jesus was highlighting that the Christian leader accepts hardship and above all is a *servant* to others. Jesus mentioned His upcoming arrest, persecution, torture and death at the hands of the men (9:31). So, how did the apostles go 180 degrees in the other direction with their conversation. Instead of talking about how they could be good 'servants', they argue about 'who is **BOSS'!**

But interestingly, this is not the first or last time they will miss Jesus' point or selectively choose not to hear words like 'cross', 'sacrifice' or 'hardship'. When Jesus mentions His torture and death in this passage, this is the second time (of 3) in Mark's gospel that Jesus talks about how He would die for His people. Scholars call these the 'Three Passion Predictions' of Jesus (Mark 8:31-32, Mark 9:30-32, Mark 10:32-34). Yet, even more interesting about the apostles, is that after Jesus makes these announcements of how personally sacrificial His leadership will be on behalf of other people's salvation, just afterward the apostles will attempt to make a 'powerplay' grabbing for power over others. First, it is Peter who tries to steer Jesus away from His cross (because Peter Himself wants to avoid it!-Mk 8:32). Then secondly, the whole team of apostles argue about who is the 'toughest' guy in the room (Mk 9:34). And even a third time, right after Jesus announced that He came to serve and suffer for His people, it was then then, that James and John try to push ahead of the others to the front of the line, and demand the seats of glory at Jesus' right and left in 'glory' (Mk 10:37). Were the apostles just not listening to Jesus? I had a seminary professor who loved to tell us repeatedly in class (maybe he thought of us this way!) that "The apostles consistently demonstrate a remarkable dexterity for missing the point of Jesus!" Jesus was very clear about the consequences of His teaching ministry and that He would meet persecution and death in Jerusalem, so it does seem the apostles go out of their way to not hear Jesus' words! Maybe it is pride and selfishness on their behalf, fearfulness or basic denial that keeps them from hearing Him. Or maybe it was simply that Jesus' teaching & style are so 'otherworldly' that it takes repeated statements before His words can sink in for them. Certainly, Jesus leads and rules like no other - who has seen a leader that wishes to be last, lowest and least in a crowd? Have we ever had a leader who willingly serves everyone else. Or a boss who rejects the comfort of offices, the glory of titles, and privileges of power to really work just as hard as the people he/she serves? We do have such a servant leader in Jesus! Jesus asks nothing of us, that He himself didn't willingly take up and do Himself. Even at the Last Supper, Jesus is adamant that the apostles hear this out. He wishes to impress this servant style of leadership upon His followers as He institutes the Holy Eucharist-Mass. (Keep in mind this is where He commands, "Do this in memory of me") In Luke 22:25-26 at the Last Supper, Jesus says, "The kings of the Gentiles lord their authority over their subjects and are addressed as 'Benefactors', but it shall not be so among you." (Recall too that in John 13:5 Jesus washed apostles; feet). As always, Jesus sets the example of service. Discipleship with Jesus means willingly accepted sacrifice and joyfully being the humble helper, putting others ahead of ourselves. Following Jesus means we do as He did, and serve as He served.
