
Greetings Everyone!

Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you? Psalm 85:6

evival has been in the news recently, both current and historic. Many of

you have seen or heard of the new movie, "The Jesus Revolution," which tells the story of the Jesus Movement that started in Southern California in the late 1960s and spread into the following decade across the nation. It documents a movement from an unlikely source. Young hippies and other counter-culture people, searching for

truth, found it in Jesus and gave their lives to following Christ. It was an unlikely revival from unlikely sources, but it happened. The other story of revival is very current. There is a Christian university and seminary called Asbury University in Kentucky. In early February, a typical weekly school chapel service became something completely different. The Holy



Spirit moved through that weekly chapel service.

The chapel service did not end, it kept going, and no one would leave. The people kept worshipping, praying, and repenting. News spread about this chapel service. They called it a revival. In the end, the service lasted two weeks, with tens of thousands of people from all over the world coming into the doors of that

school chapel to worship for a time. A little over a month removed from this event, people ask, "Was that a revival?"

As we come into April and celebrate Easter, it is important to look at that word: revival. A revival means we acknowledge something is dead, and our prayer is that what is dead has life breathed into it, bringing it back to health and restoration. Easter celebrates the biggest revival in the resurrection of Jesus Christ! Jesus was dead, factually dead. And Jesus was then revived and brought back to life.

When we desire and pray for revival, do we consider that something is actually dead? Is our prayer for revival just a means to make things better than they are now? More popular than it was before?

This Easter, if you want revival, consider what is dead or, more importantly, what needs to die. We need to put our old life and ways of thinking on the cross and sacrifice them. We need to acknowledge only Jesus can save us and others. Neither ourselves nor our pure human ambitions and selfish motivations can rescue us.

For when we were in the realm of the flesh, the sinful passions aroused by the law were at work in us, so that we bore fruit for death. But now, by dying to what once bound us, we have been released from the law so that we serve in the new way of the Spirit, and not in the old way of the written code. Romans 7:5-6

Revival starts with the resurrection of Jesus. It then spreads to our new life in the risen Christ. We then pray others find new life in Christ and put to death their old ways. That is revival.
